THAT the National Assembly mark the 94th commemorative anniversary of the Armenian Genocide in memory of the victims, and express all of our compassion and sympathy to our fellow countrymen of Armenian origin.

THAT the National Assembly support Bill C-241 which aims to remove the employment insurance waiting period and which passed second reading today in the House of Commons; that it reiterate the importance of abolishing this waiting period for workers without employment income.
