#### ORDERS OF THE DAY

#### BUSINESS HAVING PRECEDENCE

(1) Pursuant to Standing Orders 275 and 276, continuation of the debate on the motion by the Minister of Finance, - That this Assembly approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government,

And on the following want of confidence motions:

# By the Member for Rousseau:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Government for having presented a 2009-2010 budget without a recovery plan to limit the effects of the economic crisis on Québec, particularly the lack of major measures to counter dropping out of school, to adequately fund postsecondary education, to increase the productivity of businesses and minimize the number of jobs lost and to come in aid to moderate-income individuals.

# By the Member for Mercier:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Government for having presented a budget that will have effects that are totally contrary to the revolution of sustainable development announced by the Premier just two weeks ago.

# By the Member for Richelieu:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Premier as well as the Chair of the Conseil du trésor for their mismanagement of the public expenditure before the crisis that led to a structural deficit of close to 4 billion dollars and who announce major cuts in services to citizens in the coming years as well as drastic tariff increases.

# By the Leader of the Official Opposition:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Premier of Québec for having plunged Quebecers into an election campaign at a time when a serious economic crisis was erupting without establishing a profile of the public finances and of the state of the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec.

# By the Member for Gouin:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Government for not having made any commitment as regards the creation of the 15,000 spaces in subsidized child care promised during the last election campaign.

# By the Member for Iberville:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Government for having let the agricultural community down by systematically refusing to increase the budget of La Financière agricole du Québec, which has been of 300 million dollars for the past 7 years, and which will cause the organization to face a deficit of more than 1.2 billion dollars in 2009.

(2) Resuming the debate, adjourned **31 March 2009**, on the Opening Speech delivered by the Prime Minister 10 March 2009,

And on the following want of confidence motions:

# By the Leader of the Official Opposition:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Premier for his inability to exercise the leadership that Quebecers expect with regard to the historic losses of the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec and for his refusal to allow the Minister of Finance, who is responsible for the Caisse, to appear in committee.

# By the Member for Lotbinière:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Government for its lack of vision and absence of strategy enabling Quebecers to emerge stronger from the economic crisis that is currently prevailing.

# By the Member for Mercier:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Government for its stubborn pursuit of public-private partnership projects that are ineffective and more costly to taxpayers, more particularly the CHUM, the Hôtel-Dieu de Québec, the OSM concert hall and the Turcot interchange projects.

# By the Member for Ungava:

THAT the National Assembly blame the Liberal Government, which is improvising with regard to the establishment of a Northern Québec development plan without involving the Northern Québec communities in its preparation.

# By the Member for Marie-Victorin:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec severely blame the Liberal Party Government for having abandoned the objectives aiming to eliminate emergency room waiting time.

#### By the Member for Richelieu:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for its ideological stubbornness in pursuing the building of CHUM in PPP mode rather than in a conventional mode .

#### By the Member for Lac-Saint-Jean:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for its inability to resolve its multiple disputes with the Federal Government, such as the funding of postsecondary education, the reaching of agreements within the framework of the Building Canada Fund, the jurisdictional conflict regarding oil and gas exploration in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, the funding of measures for persons who are not eligible for employment insurance and the financial compensation for the ice storm crisis.

# By the Member for Borduas:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for its lack of a true desire to reduce the drop-out rate and its failure to meet the commitment made during the opening speech of 2003.

# By the Member for Iberville:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Government for its chaotic management of the listeriosis crisis and for the lack of concrete assistance measures for artisan producers to remedy this situation in the opening address of the Premier.

# By the Member for Verchères:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Premier and his Government for their lack of vision for the future of Québec, which translates in particular into the fact that the opening speech was totally silent with regard to possible measures concerning mass transit and into an economic recovery plan that is essentially based on relatively modest investments in road infrastructures and that does not provide for any additional mass transit measures.
