Complaints of Breach of Privilege or Contempt and Personal Explanations

The President informed the Assembly that he had, within the prescribed time, received a request from Mrs. Maltais, Official Opposition House Leader, to rise on a matter of privilege or contempt.

In her notice, the Official Opposition House Leader alleged that the Draveurs, Portages-de-l'Outaouais, Cœur-des-Vallées and Rives-du-Saguenay school boards were in contempt of Parliament when they increased childcare rates on 1 April 2015, invoking the provisions of Chapter VI of Bill 28, An Act mainly to implement certain provisions of the Budget Speech of 4 June 2014 and return to a balanced budget in 2015–2016.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mrs. Maltais, Official Opposition House Leader, tabled the following:

A copy of a letter, dated 27 March 2015, to school board directors-general, from Mr. Éric Thibault, Assistant Deputy Minister, Ministère de l'Éducation, de l'Enseignement supérieur et de la Recherche, about the childcare rates proposed under Bill 28, An Act mainly to implement certain provisions of the Budget Speech of 4 June 2014 and return to a balanced budget in 2015–2016.

Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), together with Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet), moved a motion on the Government's use of outsourcing; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1, Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), moved a motion concerning the Cirque du Soleil; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.
