### **Business Having Precedence**

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 14 April 2015, on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), Mrs. David (Gouin), Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin), Mr. Traversy (Terrebonne), Mr. Paradis (Lévis), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), Mr. Lemay (Masson), Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles), Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier), Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), subject to the receivability of these motions.

The debate being concluded, Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, declared that the motions stating a grievance were receivable, except the motion moved by Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), with respect to which he ruled the following:

### RULING FROM THE CHAIR

The motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon) within the framework of the Budget Speech is not receivable on the grounds that, contrary to Standing Order 191, it contains arguments.

On behalf of the Member concerned, Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, requested that the Assembly grant leave to replace the aforementioned unreceivable motion by a new motion that complies with the Standing Orders.

By leave of the Assembly, Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, tabled the motion by Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), which now reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for jeopardizing its credit rating by presenting a budget that confirms the Government's meddling in the management of the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, then proceeded to put the question on the motions stating a grievance moved during the debate.

First, the question was put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget without taking into account the consequences it would have on Quebecers.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 93 in Appendix)

Yeas: 45 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 0

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The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Bonnardel (Granby). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its lack of economic ambition and for breaking its campaign promise to create 250,000 jobs during its current mandate.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. **94** in Appendix)

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Caire (La Peltrie). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for not having a plan to bridge the anticipated deficit caused by the \$853-million gap in program spending that will have to be absorbed.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. **95** in Appendix)

Yeas: 42 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 3

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. David (Gouin). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec severely censure the Liberal Government for its 2015–2016 budget, which jeopardizes public services due to unprecedented budget cuts in the health and education networks, which will contribute to undermining the quality of the public services made available to Quebecers, and which sets in motion the impoverishment of the 530,000 employees working in these sectors by removing any leeway the Chair of the Conseil du trésor might have to negotiate the working conditions of public and parapublic sector workers in good faith.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. **96** in Appendix)

Yeas: 26 Nays: 83 Abstentions: 0

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The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget that reveals that the Plan Nord is a plan only and provides for no substantial investment.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 97 in Appendix)

Yeas: 42 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 3

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The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Traversy (Terrebonne). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget that continues to ravage the Québec Family Policy.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 98 in Appendix)

Yeas: 45 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 0

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The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Paradis (Lévis). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for breaking another election promise, namely to completely abolish the health tax during its current mandate.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 99 in Appendix)

Yeas: 45 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 0

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The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget that cuts the funding of the Ministère du Développement durable, de l'Environnement et de la Lutte contre les changements climatiques by 7.5% for 2015–2016.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 100 in Appendix)

Yeas: 45 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 0

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The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for jeopardizing its credit rating by presenting a budget that confirms the Government's meddling in the management of the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 101 in Appendix)

Yeas: 45 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec severely censure the Liberal Government for its policies of budgetary austerity, which will slow down all of Québec's regional economies, offer no support to promising sectors, fail to enable modernization of the Québec economy, and prevent Québec from transitioning to a true 21st-century economy that is respectful of the environment and of sustainable development principles.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. **102** in Appendix)

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Surprenant (Groulx). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for breaking another election promise with its preposterous pseudo-maritime strategy, which is no strategy at all and a far cry from what was promised Quebecers in the last election campaign.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 103 in Appendix)

Yeas: 42 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget that confirms this Government's lack of interest in Québec's young people.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 104 in Appendix)

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Lemay (Masson). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its inaction in dealing with the increasing disparities in wealth between Québec and the other provinces and states in North America.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 105 in Appendix)

Yeas: 42 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 3

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The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget that shamelessly cuts education funding.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. **106** in Appendix)

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget that does nothing to alleviate Quebecers' despair concerning access to their health system.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 107 in Appendix)

Yeas: 45 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. LeBel (Rimouski). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget that cuts assistance to individuals and families by \$26 million.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 108 in Appendix)

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget that makes cuts totalling \$151 million in La Financière agricole funding.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 109 in Appendix)

Yeas: 45 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 0

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The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget that substantially reduces the number of dwellings in the AccèsLogis program.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 110 in Appendix)

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for presenting a budget that perpetuates Liberal-Caquiste austerity for another year.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 111 in Appendix)

Yeas: 26 Nays: 83 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Khadir (Mercier). This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec severely censure the Liberal Government for its 2015–2016 budget, which will impoverish the vast majority of Quebecers, in particular by imposing tariffs and postponing elimination of the health contribution, and whose budgetary policy deprives the Québec State of the means it needs to fund public services and social programs, by refusing, among other things, to impose a capital tax on banks and introduce vigorous measures to reduce the cost of prescription drugs.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 112 in Appendix)

Yeas: 3 Nays: 83 Abstentions: 23

Finally, the question was put on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy.

A recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

(Division No. 113 in Appendix)

Yeas: 64 Nays: 45 Abstentions: 0

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 25 March 2015, on the motion moved by Mr. Daoust, Minister of the Economy, Innovation and Exports, that Bill 37, An Act to confirm that the cement plant and maritime terminal projects in the territory of Municipalité de Port-Daniel–Gascons are subject solely to the authorizations required under section 22 of the Environment Quality Act, do now pass in principle.

At the request of Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, Mrs. Soucy (Saint-Hyacinthe) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.
