#### **Business Having Precedence**

Opening Speech Debate of the Session

The Assembly continued the debate on the Opening Speech of the Session delivered by Mr. Charest, Premier, at the sitting of Tuesday, 10 March 2009, and on the want of confidence motions by Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière), Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mr. Ferland (Ungava).

At the end of his speech, Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin) moved the following want of confidence motion:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec severely blame the Liberal Party Government for having abandoned the objectives aiming to eliminate emergency room waiting time.

The debate continued on the Opening Speech of the Session and on the want of confidence motions by Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Ferland (Ungava) and Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin).

At the end of his speech, Mr. Simard (Richelieu) moved the following want of confidence motion:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for its ideological stubbornness in pursuing the building of CHUM in PPP mode rather than in a conventional mode.

#### **Debates Upon Adjournment**

The Assembly held two debates upon adjournment:

— the first, on a question by Mr. Simard (Richelieu) to Mrs. Courchesne, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, in remplacement of Mrs. Jérôme-Forget, Minister of Finance, about public-private partnerships;

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— the second, on a question by Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau) to Mrs. Weil, Minister of Justice, in replacement of Mr. Charest, Premier, about the process leading to the hiring of Mr. Philippe Couillard by Persistence Capital Partners.

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At 6.26 o'clock p.m., Mr. Chagnon, Second Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Wednesday, 18 March 2009, at 10.00 o'clock a.m.
