Introduction of Bills

Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following Bill:

An Act to amend the Charter of human rights and freedoms

The motion was carried.

Mr. President communicated to the Assembly and then laid upon the Table the report from the Law Clerk on the following Private Bill:

213 An Act respecting Ville de Saint-Augustin-de-Desmaures

The report states that this Bill may be introduced in the Assembly, but may not receive final passage before 21 December 2007, except as Standing Order 22 and section 35 of the Rules for the Conduct of Proceedings respecting Private Bills may otherwise provide. It further states that the notices were not drafted and published in accordance with the Rules for the Conduct of Proceedings Respecting Private Bills.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 58, An Act to amend the Act respecting labour standards with regard to absences and leave.
