#### **Motions Without Notice**

Mrs. Roy (Montarville), together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), moved a motion concerning the recommendations on secularism contained in the Bouchard-Taylor Report; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice and Minister responsible for the Status of Women, together with Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mrs. Roy (Montarville) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the Day of Action on Sexual Violence Against Women, to be held on 18 September 2015;

THAT it take this opportunity to reiterate the importance of decisive, joint action as a pledge of our common resolve to intervene to eradicate this scourge;

THAT it reaffirm that intervention in this area is important to both men and women;

THAT it thank all the individuals and groups that participated in the travelling forum on sexual assault and the parliamentary committee which preceded it;

THAT, lastly, it applaud the admirable work done by all those who, every day, fight sexual abuse and support the victims.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), together with Mrs. Roy (Montarville) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Liberal Government ask the federal political parties to formally commit to banning veiled voting.
