The Assembly was called to order at 1.40 o'clock p.m.

ROUTINE PROCEEDINGS

Statements by Members

Introduction of Bills

Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

An Act to give effect to fiscal measures announced mainly in the Budget Speech delivered on 26 March 2015

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, Bill 69 was introduced in the Assembly.

Mr. Hamad, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

An Act to allow a better match between training and jobs and to facilitate labour market entry

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, Bill 70 was introduced in the Assembly.

The President communicated to the Assembly, and then tabled, the Law Clerk's report on the following private bill:

An Act respecting the property tax applicable to PF Résolu Canada Inc. as a consumer of the electric power it produces at its hydroelectric installations in the territory of Municipalité de Saint-David-de-Falardeau

The report states that the notice was drafted and published in accordance with the Rules for the Conduct of Proceedings governing private bills.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Couillard, Premier, together with Mr. Péladeau, Leader of the Official Opposition, and Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 40th anniversary of the James Bay and Northern Québec Agreement, signed on 11 November 1975:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the importance of this historic agreement and the subsequent agreements resulting from it, which allow the Cree and Inuit to have greater control over the socio-economic development of their nations and the lands they live on.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), together with Mrs. David (Gouin), moved a motion concerning air pollution in Québec City's central districts; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, moved a motion concerning the gasoline tax; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie—Saint-Jacques), together with Mr. Traversy (Terrebonne), moved a motion concerning TransCanada's Keystone XL pipeline project; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 67, An Act mainly to improve the regulation of tourist accommodation;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 51, An Act mainly to make the administration of justice more efficient and fines for minors more deterrent;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 44, An Act to bolster tobacco control.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 11 November 2015, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Traversy (Terrebonne).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recall that it unanimously adopted a motion demanding that the Government of Québec exercise its jurisdiction in environmental matters and stop delegating its environmental assessments to the National Energy Board;

THAT it remind the Government of Québec of its list of seven conditions for approving or rejecting the TransCanada Energy East project;

THAT it stress that 87% of Quebecers want the Government of Québec to have the final say in whether or not the project to export oil from the oil sands is authorized;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to exercise its full and complete jurisdiction in environmental matters and demand that it refuse the TransCanada Energy East project.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Coiteux, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Ongoing Program Review and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, informed the Assembly that the Honourable J. Michel Doyon, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 73, An Act respecting mainly the implementation of recommendations of the pension committee of certain public sector pension plans, for its consideration and then moved that this bill do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 73 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 73 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.
