Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 18 November 2015, on the motion moved by Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice, for the passage in principle of Bill 59, An Act to enact the Act to prevent and combat hate speech and speech inciting violence and to amend various legislative provisions to better protect individuals.

Accordingly, Bill 59 was passed in principle.

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 59 be referred to the Committee on Institutions for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, together with Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), moved a motion concerning the awarding and management of public contracts in the information technologies and communications industry; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, together with Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon), Mr. Paradis (Lévis) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the Assembly mark International Men's Day and, more specifically, Québec Prostate Cancer Awareness Day;

THAT it reiterate that prostate cancer is the most widespread form of cancer among men in Canada;

THAT it salute the presence, in our gallery, of representatives from the Association professionnelle des gardes du corps du gouvernement du Québec who support the research and who participated in the fundraising campaign by selling ties and scarves to the Members.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), together with Mr. Fournier, Minister responsible for Canadian Intergovernmental Affairs and the Canadian Francophonie, Mrs. Samson (Iberville) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 40th anniversary of the Federation of Francophone and Acadian communities of Canada;

THAT it highlight the resilience and vitality of these communities;

THAT it reiterate its unwavering solidarity and support for them;

THAT it stress the importance it attaches to a strong, vibrant francophone presence in America;

THAT it acknowledge the work that remains to be done to ensure the continuing presence and influence of the French fact in America.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) moved a motion concerning energy transition; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Pursuant to Standing Order 129, Mr. Lebel, Chief Opposition Whip, moved:

THAT the Member for Duplessis be named a member of the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources in substitution for the Member for Bonaventure, and that the Member for Sanguinet be named a member of the same committee in substitution for the Member for Matane-Matapedia; THAT the Member for Richelieu be named a member of the Committee on Health and Social Services in substitution for the Member for Duplessis;

THAT the Member for Joliette be named a member of the Committee on Institutions in substitution for the Member for Richelieu;

THAT the Member for René-Lévesque be named a member of the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain in substitution for the Member for Verchères;

THAT these changes take effect immediately.

The motion was carried.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader and Minister responsible for Access to Information and the Reform of Democratic Institutions, moved that Bill 78, An Act to regulate the granting of transition allowances to Members who resign during their term of office, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mrs. David (Gouin) tabled the following:

A copy of six amendments to Bill 78, An Act to regulate the granting of transition allowances to Members who resign during their term of office.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, informed the Assembly that the Honourable J. Michel Doyon, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 74, An Act respecting mainly the implementation of certain provisions of the Budget Speech of 26 March 2015, for its consideration, and then moved that this bill do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division, and Bill 74 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, moved that Bill 74 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

At 12.26 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 188 and pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Arcand, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, moved:

THAT, within the framework of the consideration of Bill 66, Funeral Operations Act, the Committee on Health and Social Services hold special consultations and public hearings on 26 November and on 1 and 2 December 2015 in the Legislative Council Room;

THAT the Minister of Health and Social Services be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Passage

Mr. Coiteux, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Ongoing Program Review and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved the passage of Bill 73, An Act respecting mainly the implementation of recommendations of the pension committee of certain public sector pension plans.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 73 was passed.

At 3.17 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Arcand, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

At 6.01 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier) to Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, about the commercialization support program for Québec wines.
