(117) Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) – **24 November 2015** To the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy

Section 10 of Division IV of the Residential Swimming Pool Safety Regulation states that this Regulation does not apply to an installation existing before 22 July 2010 or to an installation whose swimming pool was acquired before that date, provided that the pool is installed not later than 31 October 2010.

This section of the Regulation provides for the recognition of an acquired right for pools installed before July 2010. Yet, when it comes to security, jurisprudence only rarely recognizes acquired rights.

Moreover, since a few years ago many municipalities did not require permits for pool installations, the application of this section is problematic as regards the municipality's burden of proof, for it is often impossible for the latter to know when a given pool was actually installed.

In these circumstances, has the Government thought about reviewing this section of the Regulation or worked on solutions that would make it easier for municipalities and municipal court prosecutors to apply this provision? What actions did it take to more effectively support them?

#### (118) Mr. Roberge (Chambly) – **24 November 2015** To the Minister of Health and Social Services

Dauphinelle nursing home houses 35 independent and semi-independent residents, as well as 52 residents requiring intermediate resources. Though this residence is located in Saint-Basile-le-Grand, ambulance services are ordered to transfer its patients to Honoré-Mercier hospital in Saint-Hyacinthe. However, residents as well as their families are outside of the area that is usually served by Saint-Hyacinthe hospital. This situation therefore creates emotionally challenging conditions for patients and their families. At the present time, the only destination served by Ambulances Demers inc. is Honoré-Mercier hospital in Saint-Hyacinthe.

I therefore ask the Minister of Health and Social Services if it is possible to modify the ambulance service zone.

- 1) Have you thought about allowing ambulance services of the Saint-Basile-le-Grand region to modify their obligatory destination so that they may go to a hospital centre that is more accessible to residents and their families?
- 2) In cases where Ambulances Demers inc. would not be authorized to transport Saint-Basile-le-Grand patients to Pierre-Boucher and Charles-Lemoyne hospitals, have you considered allowing another ambulance company to transport these patients to Pierre-Boucher and Charles-Lemoyne hospitals?

## (119) Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier) – **24 November 2015** To the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food

The Programme d'appui financier aux regroupements et aux associations de producteurs désignés (PAFRAD) ended on 31 March 2015 and was not renewed.

The various agricultural producers' associations that benefitted from this program to ensure their sector's development must cope with a significant income reduction, which puts them in a very difficult position.

They are waiting for the announcement of a new program that would have the same objectives.

Some of them are in the process of balancing this year's books and they don't know if the money from PAFRAD will arrive.

Can the Minister of Agriculture disclose the details of the program that replaces PAFRAD, including the amounts allocated to each group or association?

Can the Minister also tell us how he will compensate the groups and associations for the period between the end of PAFRAD and the beginning of the replacement program, during which they had no funding?
