Deferred Divisions

Motions Without Notice

Mrs. Roy (Montarville), together with Mrs. David (Gouin), moved a motion concerning the prescription period provided for in the *Election Act*; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, together with Mr. Drainville, Official Opposition House Leader, Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques) and Mrs. Roy (Arthabaska), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to follow up on the recommendations of the Charbonneau Commission with an in-depth study on implementing them.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mrs. Roy (Montarville) and Mrs. Roy (Arthabaska), moved a motion to instruct the Committee on Institutions to undertake a mandate in relation to the report of the Commission of Inquiry on the Awarding and Management of Public Contracts in the Construction Industry; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to continue and conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 76, An Act to modify the organization and governance of shared transportation in the Montréal metropolitan area;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 78, An Act to regulate the granting of transition allowances to Members who resign during their term of office; and then, continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 59, An Act to enact the Act to prevent and combat hate speech and speech inciting violence and to amend various legislative provisions to better protect individuals;
- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 54, An Act to improve the legal situation of animals.

And, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143.1, he then convened the following committee:

— the Committee on Health and Social Services, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 66, Funeral Operations Act.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 67, An Act mainly to improve the regulation of tourist accommodation, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Cousineau (Bertrand) and Mr. Martel (Nicolet-Bécancour).

The amendments were declared in order.

By leave of the Assembly, Mr. Cousineau (Bertrand) withdrew his amendment.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 252, Mr. Cousineau (Bertrand) moved a new amendment, which he indicated.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the amendment by Mr. Cousineau (Bertrand) was carried, and the amendment by Mr. Martel (Nicolet-Bécancour) was negatived.

The report, as amended, was concurred in.

Passage

Mr. Daoust, Minister of the Economy, Innovation and Exports, moved the passage of Bill 68, An Act to address the findings of the report of the appellate panel established under the Agreement on Internal Trade regarding section 4.1 of the Food Products Act.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 68 was passed.

Mr. Hamad, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, moved the passage of Bill 57, An Act to amend the Supplemental Pension Plans Act mainly with respect to the funding of defined benefit pension plans.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 57 was passed.

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Friday, 27 November 2015 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.
