Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred on 2 December 2015, on the motion moved by Mr. Hamad, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, for the passage of Bill 71, An Act respecting the settlement of certain disputes in the automotive sector in the Saguenay–Lac-Saint-Jean region.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

Mr. Paradis, Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, moved the passage of Bill 54, An Act to improve the legal situation of animals.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Debates on Reports from Committees

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Administration, which met on 8, 16 and 23 September, on 7 and 22 October, and on 18 November 2015 to hear deputy ministers and heads of public bodies on: the administrative management of the Commission des libérations conditionnelles; the administrative management of the Régie des marchés agricoles et alimentaires du Québec; contracts presenting risk situations for the Ministère de l'Agriculture, des Pêcheries et de l'Alimentation; the application of the law with regard to dam safety and operations; occupational injuries—worker compensation and rehabilitation; the administrative management of the Institut de tourisme et d'hôtellerie du Québec; the administrative management and financial commitments of the Commission de la fonction publique; and the administrative management and financial commitments of the Ministère du Conseil exécutif. The report contains observations, conclusions and 30 recommendations.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 56 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 33 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes to the Second Opposition Group; and 7 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes for the Member for Arthabaska. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The Assembly continued the debate on consideration of the report from the Committee on Public Administration.

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.

The Assembly continued the debate on consideration of the report from the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, which examined the policy directions, activities and administrative management of the Commission de protection du territoire agricole du Québec on 6 November 2014 and 14 and 19 May 2015. The Committee also held deliberative meetings on 24 September, 6 November and 4 December 2014, and 24 February, 19 March, 2 April, 6 and 27 May, 11 June, 19 November and 1 December 2015 with regard to this order. The report contains 16 recommendations.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 56 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 33 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes to the Second Opposition Group; and 7 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes for the Member for Arthabaska.
