Government Bills

Passage

Mr. Dupuis, Minister of Public Security, moved the passage of Bill 80, An Act to amend the Police Act.

During the debate, Mr. Dupuis, Minister of Public Security, moved that Bill 80 be referred to a Committee of the Whole for the consideration of an amendment that he specified.

This motion was carried.

Mr. Dupuis, Minister of Public Security, moved that the Assembly then resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole.

The amendment by Mr. Dupuis, Minister of Public Security, was considered and then carried in Committee of the Whole.

Bill 80, as amended, was reported to the Assembly, which concurred in the Committee's report.

And debate continuing on the motion for the passage of Bill 80;

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 80 was passed.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 88, Private Security Act, together with the amendment handed in by Mr. Dupuis, Minister of Public Security.

The amendment was declared in order.

After debate thereon, the amendment was carried.

The report, as amended, was concurred in.

Passage

Mr. Fournier, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, moved the passage of Bill 19, An Act to establish the Sports and Physical Activity Development Fund.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 19 was passed.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 1, An Act to reduce the debt and establish the Generations Fund.

The debate being concluded, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries and Food on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 24, An Act to amend the Act respecting the Ministère de l'Agriculture, des Pêcheries et de l'Alimentation and the Act respecting the Ministère du Revenu.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

Passage

Mr. Pelletier, Minister responsible for Canadian Intergovernmental Affairs, Francophones within Canada, the Agreement on Internal Trade, the Reform of Democratic Institutions and Access to Information, moved the passage of Bill 86, An Act to amend the Act respecting Access to documents held by public bodies and the Protection of personal information and other legislative provisions.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 86 was passed.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 22, An Act to amend the Election Act to encourage and facilitate voting, together with the amendment handed in by Mr. Pelletier, Minister for the Reform of Democratic Institutions.

The amendment was declared in order.

After debate thereon, the amendment was carried.

The report, as amended, was concurred in.

Passage

Mr. Marcoux, Minister responsible for the administration of legislation respecting the professions, moved the passage of Bill 7, An Act to amend the Chartered Accountants Act.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 7 was passed.

Mr. Marcoux, Minister responsible for the administration of legislation respecting the professions, moved the passage of Bill 14, An Act to amend the Professional Code as regards the issue of permits.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 14 was passed.

Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Wednesday, 14 June 2006, at 10.00 o'clock a.m.
