- (130) Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) **9 February 2016**To the Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie

We would like to receive a copy of the following documents concerning the participation of the Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie in the mission to France and Belgium in January 2016:

- 1. The list of persons who accompanied the Minister;
- 2. The overall expenses related to the mission as well as to its preparation, and charged to the Ministère des Relations internationales et de La Francophonie;
- 3. The Minister's entire mission agenda;
- 4. The list of all persons met as well as a copy of their business cards;
- 5. For each working meeting held by the Minister, we would like to have: the list of persons present, the location, the duration, the details of expenses incurred, the subject and minutes, as well as the commitments made by each party (regarding employment, salaries, benefits to Ouébec, etc.);

(148) Mr. Lisée (Rosemont) – **11 February 2016**To the Minister responsible for Labour

- What is the total number of arbitration requests received, per month, since 2012?
- How many arbitration requests have come from RI-RTFs, per month, since 2012?
- How many cases went before an arbitration board and when?
- What is the average waiting time?
- Is the Minister satisfied with this waiting time?
- What does she intend to do to reduce this waiting time?
- Does the Minister plan to appoint new arbitrators so that hearings can be held within a shorter period of time? If so, what is her timeline?
- Does she foresee establishing timelines so that the hearings are obligatorily held within a reasonable number of days?

(149) Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon) – **16 February 2016**To the Minister of Health and Social Services

In its report tabled in November 2015, the Auditor General (AG) demonstrated, after reviewing the agreements negotiated between the Liberal Government and the medical federations, that additional sums were paid to physicians upon closing the agreement on the averaging of wage increases. Page 21, chapter 2, of the report indicates that when the memorandums of agreement were ratified, the sums to be averaged over an eight-year period, which total \$5,675.6 million (table 6, line B), were overstated by \$148.5 million compared to the sums remaining to be paid in accordance with the compensation agreements, which total \$5,527.1 million.

In its comments, the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux mentions that in paragraph 50, the Auditor General indicates that the sums to be averaged were overstated by \$148.5 million over the term of the agreement and that if there indeed was an error, the MSSS will correct it. (page 37 of the AG's report, chapter 2).

- How does the government plan to recover the overstated \$148.5 million paid to physicians following the signing of an agreement on the averaging of their wage increases?
- How will it correct its error?

(150) Mrs. Roy (Montarville) – **17 February 2016**To the Minister of the Economy, Science and Innovation

Last 3 February, the Minister of the Economy, Science and Innovation stated that U.S. retailer Lowe's had given her the guarantee that jobs would be maintained as would RONA's headquarters in Boucherville. However, on 9 February she acknowledged that ultimately it will be up to the federal government to decide whether the guarantees provided by Lowe's to acquire RONA are sufficient to approve this transaction.

There remains some uncertainty with regard to the manner in which these guarantees were reportedly given to her by Lowe's. I would like to know exactly how these guarantees were given to her: Can she confirm if they were given verbally or in writing?

Would she also table all the documents provided by Lowe's further specifying these guarantees, particularly concerning the maintaining of jobs and headquarters in Boucherville?

Lastly, in light of the guarantees that were given to the Minister, can she tell me exactly how many jobs Lowe's plans to maintain at the headquarters in Boucherville, and over what period of time?

(151) Mrs. Soucy (Saint-Hyacinthe) – **24 February 2016**To the Minister of Energy and Natural Resources

For the past several months, my political party and I have been trying to obtain information from Hydro-Québec. To that end, we have sent several access to information requests.

On numerous occasions, Hydro-Québec refused to provide the requested information, citing insurmountable obstacles to accomplish this, such as specific tracking operations in their computer systems and data extraction, analysis and validation work.

Last January, Hydro-Québec management informed us, by telephone then in writing, that we were simply sending too many requests and that it would not be able to answer our questions within the timelines set out in the *Act respecting Access to documents held by public bodies and the Protection of personal information*.

We collaborated with the Crown corporation in good faith and, on the one hand, for several weeks stopped sending requests for information, and, on the other hand, accepted that replies would be sent to us with some delay.

In spite of our efforts to collaborate and the additional time given to the Crown corporation, Hydro-Québec refused to provide us with all the responses to our requests.

Unfortunately, this situation is not unique and a great number of citizens and groups wishing to obtain information from Hydro-Québec have experienced this repeatedly.

Despite the greater transparency promised in June 2015 by the new chief executive officer of Hydro-Québec, Mr. Éric Martel, tangible results are not forthcoming.

I feel that this situation can no longer go on and that Hydro-Québec must comply with the spirit and intent of the Act by ceasing its lack of collaboration and by demonstrating the transparency that is expected of a public body.

I would like to know what actions the Minister of Energy has taken since June 2015 for Hydro-Québec to show greater transparency and, in light of the current situation, what actions does he intend to take to correct Hydro-Québec's current lack of transparency and collaboration?

(152) Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) – **25 February 2016**To the Minister of Education, Recreation and Sport

In September 2013, in an opinion entitled "Un engagement collectif pour maintenir et rehausser les compétences en littératie des adultes", the Conseil supérieur de l'éducation made recommendations to the then Minister of Education, Recreation and Sport de l'époque (recommendation 10, p. 142) regarding a substantial increase in the budget allocated to the Programme d'action communautaire sur le terrain de l'éducation. The Conseil stressed the merits of the existence of two organization networks providing literacy services, the school network and the network of independent community action literacy organizations.

Last 15 September, the National Assembly unanimously carried a motion recognizing the scope of the problem of illiteracy in Québec as well as the the essential role played by community-based literacy groups in fighting illiteracy.

Four months later, on 12 January 2016, the Member for Charlesbourg, then Minister of Education, Higher Education and Research, publicly called into question the financing granted to literacy organizations, indicating that he wished to evaluate the amounts that were at his disposal and determine where they must be allocated to make a difference.

In light of the elements brought to the attention of the Minister of Education, Recreation and Sport, we would like him to answer the following questions:

- Does the Minister intend to respect the 2015-2018 financial assistance agreements of each literacy organization financed by PACTE?
- What does the Minister of Education, Recreation and Sport plan on doing to financially consolidate the literacy organizations whose essential role has been recognized by all of the Members of the National Assembly last 15 September?
- (153) Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean) **25 February 2016**To the Minister of Education, Recreation and Sport

Last 15 September, the National Assembly unanimously carried a motion on literacy.

Four months later, on 12 January 2016, the Member for Charlesbourg, then Minister of Education, Higher Education and Research, publicly called into question the financing granted to literacy organizations, indicating that he wished to evaluate the amounts that were at his disposal and determine where they must be allocated to make a difference.

The 128 literacy organizations, recognized and financed by the Ministère de l'Éducation, through the Programme d'action communautaire sur le terrain de l'éducation (PACTE), reported in May 2015 financial requests of \$22,052,551, while their total financing amounts to \$12,817,185 for 2015-2016. This represents a difference of more than \$9.2 million. They also renewed their respective triennial financial assistance agreements last spring, indicating the amount to which each organization is entitled for the years 2015-2016, 2016-2017 and 2017-2018.

Lastly, in September 2013, in an opinion entitled "Un engagement collectif pour maintenir et rehausser les compétences en littératie des adultes", the Conseil supérieur de l'éducation made recommendations to the then Minister of Education, Recreation and Sport (recommendation 10, p. 142), within the framework of the Programme d'action communautaire sur le terrain de l'éducation, to ensure, in the short term, the financial consolidation of the network of independent community action literacy organizations that are already accredited and, in the medium term, to substantially increase the budget allocated to the programme, to see to the network's expansion by the accreditation of new groups.

- What is the Minister's intended course of action in terms of financing in the coming years with regard to recognizing and financing the 128 literacy organizations financed by his department?
- Will the 2015-2018 financial assistance agreements of each literacy organization financed by PACTE be respected?
- Does the Minister of Education intend to follow up on the recommendation of the Conseil supérieur de l'éducation concerning the financial consolidation of the network of independent community action literacy organizations recognized under PACTE, on the one hand, by indexing each organization's annual subsidy, and, on the other hand, by injecting more funds into their mission financing?
