## WRITTEN QUESTIONS

(169) Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean) – **17 March 2016**To the Minister of Health and Social Services

Last 18 August, the cancellation of the expansion work on the laboratories at Hôpital Haut-Richelieu created confusion and misunderstanding among my constituents. Since this decision was taken, I personally brought the matter to your attention; I had a written question placed on the National Assembly's Order Paper on 15 September 2015; I asked a question during Oral Question Period on 12 November 2015; and I tabled a petition entitled "Situation des laboratoires de l'Hôpital du Haut-Richelieu et projet Optilab", signed by close to 4000 petitioners, last 10 February. It's clear that none of my interventions, nor any of my questions, and none of the actions undertaken by my community received a satisfactory answer. Considering your recent reply regarding this petition and in spite of the fact that I do not share your opinion on the transfer of a good part of our laboratory to Hôpital Charles-Le Moyne, I would like to know the following:

• How will you apply the recommendations made in the feasibility study conducted by your department?

- Can we be certain that quality of care will improve?
- Currently, as is provided for in the Ministère's project, does the Hôpital Charles-LeMoyne laboratory have the capacity to alone analyze 70 % of Hôpital du Haut-Richelieu's samples and three-quarters of the samples currently analyzed by the remaining Montérégie hospital laboratories?
- Why not share the tasks of the future Optilab host server among Hôpital Charles-Le Moyne and Hôpital du Haut-Richelieu, since both hospitals will henceforth be a part of the same CISSS?
- How will the vacant laboratory premises be used (over 85 % of the finished area) at Hôpital du Haut-Richelieu?
- What are the costs associated with the cancellation of the laboratory expansion project, if we take into account the amounts invested for studies, plans, deconstruction, penalities, etc.?
- What amounts will need to be invested to create the computer interface that is required to complete the Optilab project?
- How will specimen transportation to Hôpital Charles-LeMoyne laboratories be carried out and what will transportation costs be?
