The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.3 and 185, Mr. Couillard, Premier, together with Mr. Péladeau, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly pay tribute to Jean, Louis, Marc and Martine Lapierre, Nicole Beaulieu, Pascal Gosselin and Fabrice Labourel, who perished in a plane crash on 29 March 2016 over the Magdalen Islands;

THAT it underline Mr. Jean Lapierre's significant contribution to political life and the media in Québec and Canada;

THAT it observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims of this tragedy.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Drainville, Official Opposition House Leader, together with Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved a motion concerning Investissement Québec, the Ministère du Développement économique and the company Premier Tech; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, together with Mrs. David (Gouin), moved a motion concerning the prescription period provided for in the *Election Act*; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. David (Gouin) moved a motion to set up a special parliamentary committee on the fight against corruption and collusion; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue the debate on the Budget Speech;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 64, Firearms Registration Act;
- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 76, An Act to modify the organization and governance of shared transportation in the Montréal metropolitan area.

And by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, he convened the following committee:

— the Committee on Culture and Education, to continue and conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 86, An Act to modify the organization and governance of school boards to give schools a greater say in decision-making and ensure parents' presence within each school board's decision-making body.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

Mrs. Weil, Minister of Immigration, Diversity and Inclusiveness, moved the passage of Bill 77, Québec Immigration Act.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 77 was passed.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, the proceedings continued beyond 1.00 o'clock p.m.

At 1.04 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 97, the debate on the report from the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources was adjourned.

The proceedings resumed at 3.02 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Drainville, Official Opposition House Leader, moved:

THAT the National Assembly mandate the Auditor General of Québec to analyze the awarding of an \$11.2M loan and \$8.5M subsidy to the company Premier Tech, by Investissement Québec and the Ministère du Développement économique respectively, announced by Premier Jean Charest on 7 May 2012;

THAT the Auditor General do everything in her power to report to the Assembly by 1 June 2016.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 51 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 30 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 21 minutes to the Second Opposition Group; and 7 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes to the Member for Arthabaska. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, tabled the following:
