BUSINESS HAVING PRECEDENCE

- (1) Pursuant to Standing Orders 275 and 276, continuation of the debate on the motion by the Minister of Finance, –That this Assembly approves the budgetary policy of the Government,

And on the motions stating a grievance moved by:

The Member for Rousseau:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its lack of an economic policy, which has resulted in stagnating private-sector investments, an unrelenting burden on families and the Government's reneging on its promise to create 250,000 jobs.

The Member for Granby:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for having increased every Québec citizen's tax burden by an average of \$750 since the beginning of its term in office.

The Member for Mercier:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec severely censure the Liberal Government for its 2016–2017 budget and its \$2 billion surplus paid in full into the Generations Fund, which keep Québec in a permanent state of austerity and prevent adequate funding of public services, in particular those of the health and social services network.

The Member for Sanguinet:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its austerity policy, which jeopardizes Québec's economic growth.

The Member for La Peltrie:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for lacking a credible plan to bridge the remaining \$890 million gap in 2017–2018 program spending.

The Member for Gaspé:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for the lack of concrete measures meeting the regions' needs, especially those of the resource regions, in its 2016–2017 budget.

The Member for Rosemont:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for having tabled a budget inspired by the practices of Stephen Harper's Conservative Government, which Quebecers rejected massively in the last federal general election.

The Member for Verchères:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for forsaking Québec's formal claim to have the federal contribution to health funding restored to 25% immediately.

The Member for Hochelaga-Maisonneuve:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for having tabled a budget that reduces the amounts allocated to social housing.

The Member for Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec severely censure the Liberal Government for its 2016–2017 budget and its support plan in key sectors of the economy that do not clearly promote the Québec economy’s ecological transition.

The Member for Joliette:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for the cutbacks of \$5 million imposed on the Director of Criminal and Penal Prosecutions and for not allocating the \$30 million accumulated in the Crime Victims Assistance Fund and the Access to Justice Fund for the purposes intended.

The Member for Berthier:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its successive cuts to La Financière agricole funding.

The Member for Gouin:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec severely censure the Liberal Government for its 2016–2017 budget and its Plan for Success in Education and Higher Education, which does not counterbalance the public education system’s chronic underfunding caused by budgetary cutbacks made by this government and previous governments.

The Member for Bourget:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for the lack of adequate financial means in its 2016–2017 budget for the francization of new Quebecers.

The Member for René-Lévesque:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for doing nothing to assist or support entrepreneurs and businesses trying to get Québec back on its feet.

To the Minister of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification,

Built in 1915 in the Vieux-Saint-Jean sector, the Gouin bridge was declared a bridge of strategic importance by your department on 25 May 2005. The heavy traffic load, the cost of rebuilding the bridge and its availability as an alternative route for Highway 35 make the reconstruction of this infrastructure a major issue, one of primary concern for the Haut-Richelieu region. In a document dated 29 October 2012, the final recommendation of the Direction des structures's decision-making committee provided for the bridge deck replacement before 2015. However, the deck has yet to be replaced.

I interpellated your colleague, the Member for Marguerite-Bourgeoys, then Minister of Transport, on several occasions with regard to the reconstruction of the Gouin bridge. In November 2014, a member of his office's staff confirmed to me in writing that the project was ongoing and that the budgets set aside for this purpose were included in the 2014-2016 projects schedule, and that the Cabinet had authorized the preparation of the business case. In December 2015, according to the information made public by Le Canada Français newspaper, the said business case still had not been sent to the Cabinet, since the agreements between the City of Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu and Parks Canada had not yet been finalized. As I did not receive any answer to my letter of last 29 January concerning this matter specifically, I will repeat my questions regarding the reconstruction of the Gouin bridge in the Vieux-Saint-Jean sector.

- Is Gouin bridge in its current state considered safe, despite the fact that its deck has not yet been replaced?
- Would it be possible to make public the latest assessments regarding the bridge's condition rating to reassure the citizens of the Haut-Richelieu region?
- Was an agreement establishing the sharing of costs and responsibilities between your department and the City of Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu finalized? If so, what does it consist of?
- Was a tentative agreement reached with Parks Canada with regard to obtaining surface rights for the construction of the bridge over the Chambly canal?
- When is construction work expected to begin and end?
- Can you make public the environmental studies carried out with respect to this project?
