**An Act respecting development of the  
small-scale alcoholic beverage industry**

Section 2

**AMENDMENT:**

In proposed section 2:

1. Replace “the alcoholic fermentation of fruit juice, reconstituted fruit juice, fruit must, honey or maple syrup” in subparagraph 2 proposed by paragraph 3 by “alcoholic fermentation”.
2. Strike out subparagraph 4 proposed by paragraph 3.
3. Replace “alcohol and spirits he makes for sale” in the second paragraph proposed by paragraph 4 by “alcoholic beverages he makes for sale that are ready for marketing”.
4. Replace “et du troisième alinéa” in the French text in the paragraph amended by paragraph 5 by “et du troisième alinéas”.

**AMENDMENT:**

Replace proposed section 4 by:

4. Section 24.2 of the Act is amended by replacing the second paragraph by the following paragraph:

“Unless he ships them outside Québec, the holder of a small-scale beer producer’s permit may sell the alcoholic beverages he makes only if he sells them at the place where they are produced, for consumption on the premises or for consumption elsewhere, and if he is the holder of a permit, issued under the Act respecting liquor permits (chapter P-9.1), authorizing alcoholic beverages to be sold for consumption on the premises.”



REGULATION RESPECTING USE OF RAW MATERIALS BY HOLDERS  
OF A SMALL-SCALE WINE PRODUCER'S PERMIT


“16.1. The Regulation respecting use of raw materials by holders of a small-scale wine producer's permit, the text of which appears below, is enacted.

“REGULATION RESPECTING USE OF RAW MATERIALS BY HOLDERS  
OF A SMALL-SCALE WINE PRODUCER'S PERMIT

“1. The proportions of the raw materials composing the wine made by a small-scale production permit holder must be as follows:

- (1) at least 50%: the permit holder's own grapes, fresh or processed;
- (2) no more than 15%: fresh or processed grapes, grape juice or grape must concentrate that may come from outside Québec;
- (3) the remainder may consist of fresh or processed grapes produced by another Québec farm producer.

However, from the vintage year 2022, the permit holder must make his wine from fresh or processed grapes that are 100% Québec grown, of which at least 50% comes from the permit holder's own fresh or processed grapes.”

**AMENDMENT:**

Insert before section 19:

**18.1.** Holders of a distiller's permit issued under the Act respecting the Société des alcools du Québec (chapter S-13) who, not later than (*insert the date that is two years after the date of coming into force of section 5 of this Act*), abandon their permit to obtain a small-scale production permit authorizing them to make alcohol and spirits may sell off any remaining reserves of alcohol and spirits they had made previously. The rules applicable to the original permit apply to the sale of such alcohol and spirits.

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Section 16.2

**AMENDMENT:**

Insert after proposed section 16.1:

**16.2.** Section 2 of the Regulation respecting the terms of sale of alcoholic beverages by holders of a grocery permit (chapter S-13, r. 6) is amended by striking out “without indication of origin and without indication of the type of grape,” in subparagraph 3 of the first paragraph.
