Motions Without Notice

Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, within the framework of the consideration of Bill 129, An Act to amend the Act respecting owners and operators of heavy vehicles and other legislative provisions, the Committee on Transportation and the Environment hold special consultations and public hearings on 1 December 2005, in Louis-Joseph-Papineau Room, and that, for this purpose, it hear the following groups:

A period of 20 minutes shall be allotted for the closing statements, which time period shall be divided as follows: 10 minutes for the Members sitting in Opposition and 10 minutes for the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government:

The Minister of Transport shall be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly under Standing Order 84, the motion was carried.

- the second, on a question by Mr. Bédard (Chicoutimi) to Mr. Marcoux, Minister of Justice, about Mr. Beryl Wajsman not being on the Lobbyists Registry;
- the third, on a question by Mr. Bouchard (Vachon) to Mrs. Théberge, Minister of Families, Seniors and the Status of Women, about the impact of Bill 124, Educational Childcare Act, on the commercialization of educational childcare services; Mr. Gautrin, Minister for Online Government, replaced the Minister of Families, Seniors and the Status of Women for this debate.
