QUÉBEC

The Assembly was called to order at 10.03 o'clock a.m.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Charbonneau (Borduas) moved:

THAT the National Assembly deplore that over 40,000 Quebecers are still waiting for surgery beyond medically acceptable delays.

Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, announced that he had apportioned the speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion as follows: ten minutes shall be allotted for a reply by its mover and ten minutes shall be set aside for the independent Members; the two parliamentary groups shall share equally the rest of the time allotted for this debate; within this framework, any time not used by a parliamentary group may be added to that of the other group, while any time not used by the independent Members will be redistributed equally amongst the parliamentary groups, it having been agreed that this apportionment may not be carried out before the time allotted to both parliamentary groups has entirely expired; and individual addresses shall not be limited.

And debate arising on the motion moved by Mr. Charbonneau (Borduas);

At the request of Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, Mr. Charbonneau (Borduas) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

At the end of her address, Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière) moved:

THAT the motion by the Member for Borduas be amended as follows: by adding, after the word "deplore" the word "today", and by adding, after the word "waiting" the words ", just as in 2002,". The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly deplore today that over 40,000 Quebecers are still waiting, just as in 2002, for surgery beyond medically acceptable delays.

The debate continued on the main motion by Mr. Charbonneau (Borduas) and on the amendment by Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière), subject to the receivability of the latter, which Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, took under advisement.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, rendered his decision on the receivability of the amendment motion.

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

The amendment motion is receivable as it does not repudiate, set aside or alter the nature of the principle of the main motion. It does however extend its scope, which complies with the criteria established in jurisprudence. Moreover, it is not for the Chair to determine the merits of the question nor to question the relevance, truth or accuracy of the facts adduced, as regards both the main motion and the amendment motion.

The debate continued on the main motion by Mr. Charbonneau (Borduas) and on the amendment by Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the amendment motion.

The motion was negatived.

The question was put on the motion by Mr. Charbonneau (Borduas); a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Moreau, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the present sitting day.

At 12.01 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 2.00 o'clock p.m.

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The proceedings resumed at 2.06 o'clock p.m.
