Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. Barrette, Minister of Health and Social Services, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the divisions, which had been deferred at the sitting of 19 October 2016, on the motion moved by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Bérubé, Official Opposition House Leader, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

First, the question was put on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Bérubé, Official Opposition House Leader.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Jonquière be amended as follows:

By replacing, in the second paragraph, the words "one of Québec's resource regions" by the words "a region far from Québec's urban centres"; and

By replacing, in the third paragraph, the words "comprise five representatives from Québec's regions, including two from the Capitale-Nationale region" by the words "so that Québec's regions, including the Capitale-Nationale region, are appropriately represented".

The amendment motion was negatived on the following vote:

(Division No. 243 in Appendix)

Yeas: 44 Nays: 64 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion moved by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Liberal Government immediately suspend any and all measures aimed at service centralization that are harmful to Québec's regions;

THAT it ask the Government to appoint a Member from one of Québec's resource regions as Minister of Regions and as Minister of Regional Development;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government of Québec to modify the composition of its advisory committee on economics and innovation to comprise five representatives from Québec's regions, including two from the Capitale-Nationale region.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Samson (Iberville), together with Mr. Fortin, Minister of Culture and Communications, Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government of Québec and the Minister of Culture and Communications to recognize improvisation as an artistic movement symbolic of Québec culture, a unique form of expression and a full-fledged artistic discipline;

THAT the Assembly demand that this recognition be written into Québec's new cultural policy in order to facilitate its funding.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly officially recognize that 15 January henceforth be designated National Living-Together-in-Harmony Day;

THAT, on this occasion, the Assembly express its determination to create conditions conducive to greater acceptance of difference and diversity, in Québec and the world over, in a spirit of openness to one another;

THAT it highlight the importance of working together to fight radicalization leading to violence;

THAT, finally, the Assembly earmark National Living-Together-in-Harmony Day to commemorate the lives lost particularly in Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu, Ottawa, Jakarta and Ouagadougou.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier) moved a motion concerning the Canada-European Union Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. David (Gouin), together with Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for the Status of Women, Mrs. Jean (Chicoutimi) and Mrs. Roy (Montarville), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the importance of prevention and of raising awareness to effectively fight sexism and the rape culture;

THAT the Members of the National Assembly demand that the Government strategy to prevent and fight sexual violence be made public as soon as possible.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:
