The Assembly was called to order at 10.01 o'clock a.m.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Landry, Leader of the Official Opposition, moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec demand a major redirection of the Liberal Government's policies.

Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mr. Cusano, First Vice-President, announced that he had apportioned the speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion as follows: 10 minutes shall be allotted for a reply by its mover and 10 minutes shall be set aside for the independent Members; the two parliamentary groups shall share equally the rest of the time allotted for this debate; within this framework, any time not used by a parliamentary group may be added to that of the other group, while any time not used by the independent Members will be redistributed equally among the parliamentary groups, and individual addresses will not be limited.

The debate arose on the motion by Mr. Landry, Leader of the Official Opposition.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 20 and 97, the proceedings continued beyond 12.00 o'clock p.m.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings later on in today's sitting.
