IV. Government Motions

(25) 15 March 2006

Motion by the Minister of International Relations:

THAT, pursuant to section 22.3 of the *Act respecting the Ministère des Relations internationales*, the National Assembly approve the Kyoto Protocol to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

In compliance with section 22.3 of the *Act respecting the Ministère des Relations internationales*, this motion cannot be debated before 25 March 2006.

(26) Motion 23 March 2006

Motion by the Minister of Justice:

THAT the National Assembly:

- I** Concur in the position and justifications given by the government and stipulated in its new answer to the report from the Comité de la rémunération des juges de la Cour du Québec et des cours municipales for the period of 2001-2004, tabled on 22 March 2006 by the Minister of Justice; and
- II** Concerning the justices of the Court of Québec and of the municipal courts of Laval, Montréal and Québec:
 1. Approve Recommendations 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 of the report from the Comité de la rémunération des juges de la Cour du Québec et des cours municipales which was tabled in the National Assembly on 18 October 2001 and whose sessional paper number is 549-20011018, except for the section of Recommendation 6 regarding the full indexation of the portion of the retirement pension accumulated since 1 July 1990;
 2. Reject the section of Recommendation 6 of the Comité with regard to the full indexation of the portion of the retirement pension accumulated since 1 July 1990;
 3. Amend Recommendations 1, 2 and 12 of the Comité so as to:

- a) set annual salary of Court of Québec associate justices at:
 - \$153,813 as from 1 July 2001;
 - \$157,658 as from 1 July 2002;
 - \$160,811 as from 1 July 2003;

- b) set the percentage rates of the supplementary remuneration paid to justices exercising managerial duties at the Court of Québec, as from 1 July 2001, as follows:
 - chief justice : 14 %;
 - senior associate chief justice : 12 %;
 - associate chief justice : 10 %;
 - coordinating justice: 8 %;
 - associate coordinating justice: 7 %;

- c) set the annual salary of the associate justices of the municipal courts of Laval, Montréal and Québec at:
 - \$145,573 as from 1 July 2001;
 - \$149,212 as from 1 July 2002;
 - \$152,196 as from 1 July 2003;

- d) the supplementary remuneration paid to justices exercising managerial duties at the municipal courts of Laval, Montréal and Québec, the expenses incurred in the performance of duties, the pension plan and other benefits of the justices of these courts be adjusted as are those of the justices of the Court of Québec;

III Concerning the municipal court justices other than those of Laval, Montréal and Québec:

1. Approve Recommendations 4 and 6 of the report from the Comité de la rémunération des juges de la Cour du Québec et des cours municipales which was tabled in the National Assembly on 18 October 2001 and whose sessional paper number is 549-20011018;

2. Amend Recommendation 1 of the Comité with regard to the remuneration per sitting and per day in order that, as from 1 January 2002, their remuneration be set as follows:
 - \$496 per sitting for a sitting lasting less than 2 hours;
 - \$662 for a sitting lasting between 2 and 5 hours;
 - \$1324 for a sitting lasting more than 5 hours;

- \$1324 for the daily maximum remuneration;
- 3. Amend Recommendation 2 of the Comité in order that the annual maximum remuneration of a municipal justice be increased to \$148,288, regardless of the number of municipal courts in which he performs his duties;
- 4. Amend Recommendation 3 of the Comité in order that the remuneration of the municipal justices established in paragraphs 2 and 3 above be increased by 2.5 % as from 1 January 2003;
- 5. Amend Recommendation 5 of the Comité in order that, as from 1 July 2001:
 - the annual salary of the chief justice of the municipal courts be harmonized with that of the associate chief justice of the Court of Québec to be set at \$153,813 and that a supplementary remuneration of 10 % and an amount of \$8500 for the expenses incurred in the performance of his duties be granted to him;
 - the same benefits enjoyed by the justices of the Court of Québec, including the pension plan and group insurance plan, be granted to him;
 - the salary of the chief justice be increased and indexed in the same manner and at the same time as that of the justices of the Court of Québec.

(27)28 March 2006

Motion by the Government House Leader under Standing Order 146:

THAT within the framework of the insurance contributions increase proposals made public by the SAAQ, the Committee on Transportation and the Environment hear the chairman and chief executive officer of the Société de l'assurance automobile du Québec, according to the schedule indicated hereafter:

On Tuesday, 11 April 2006

Beginning at 9.30 o'clock a.m., for a period of 30 minutes, the Committee shall hear the opening statements, which shall be distributed as follows: 15 minutes for the parliamentary group forming the Government and 15 minutes for the Members sitting in opposition;

Upon the conclusion of these statements, the Committee shall hear the chairman and chief executive officer of the Société de l'assurance automobile du Québec for a period of 60 minutes;

THAT, at the end of this presentation, the Committee shall exchange views for a period of 60 minutes, which shall be shared equally among the Members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition;

Upon the conclusion of the Routine Proceedings, the Committee members shall continue their exchange with the chairman and chief executive officer of the Société de l'assurance automobile du Québec for a period of 90 minutes, which shall be shared equally among the Members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition;

A period of 30 minutes shall be allotted for the closing statements, which time period shall be divided as follows: 15 minutes for the Members sitting in opposition and 15 minutes for the Members of the parliamentary group forming the Government.

(28)30 March 2006

Motion by the Minister responsible for Canadian Intergovernmental Affairs, Francophones within Canada, the Agreement on Internal Trade, the Reform of Democratic Institutions and Access to Information:

THAT the National Assembly strongly denounce the most recent approach of the Conseil de la souveraineté to publish and distribute a so-called pedagogical manual entitled "Parlons de souveraineté à l'école", intended for all workers in the Québec education network and aiming to promote Québec independence in schools;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate the fundamental principle that the education sector not be used for political propaganda purposes or partisan approaches.
