Passage in Principle

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and Bill 22 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader, moved that Bill 22 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Labour and the Economy.

- the third, on a question by Mr. Valois (Joliette) to Mr. Béchard, Minister of Employment, Social Solidarity and Family Welfare, about child care services tariffs. Mrs. Théberge, Minister for Family Welfare, replaced the Minister for this debate.

Mr. Dupuis, Government House Leader, moved that the Assembly adjourn its proceedings until Tuesday, 18 November 2003, at 2.00 o'clock p.m.
