Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 2 November 2016, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mrs. Roy (Montarville).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize Québec's significant shortcomings in the area of immigrant integration, francization and employability;

THAT the Assembly ask the Government to reduce annual immigration thresholds to 40,000, step up efforts to integrate immigrants and improve their French-language skills and implement mandatory francization classes for newcomers.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 298, he then informed the Assembly that the interpellation scheduled for Friday, 4 November 2016 between Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) and Mr. Lessard, Minister of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification, on the Réseau électrique métropolitain (REM) and its overall impact on the development and financing of public transportation in Québec, is deferred until Tuesday, 8 November 2016 from 8.30 to 10.30 o'clock a.m.

Government Bills

Passage

Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, moved the passage of Bill 110, An Act respecting the process of negotiation of collective agreements and the settlement of disputes in the municipal sector.
