ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

Mr. Blais, Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity, moved the passage of Bill 70, An Act to allow a better match between training and jobs and to facilitate labour market entry.

A debate arose thereon.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Blais, Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity, was adjourned in the name of Mr. LeBel (Rimouski).

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Marceau (Rousseau) moved:

THAT the National Assembly note the desire expressed by Québec's intergovernmental affairs minister to find a win-win solution to the dispute between Québec and Ottawa over the Federal Government's awarding of a loan guarantee covering the entire Muskrat Falls hydroelectric project;

THAT the National Assembly call for an identical loan guarantee from the Federal Government covering the entire current and future debt incurred by Hydro-Québec for its hydroelectric and green energy projects;

THAT the National Assembly call for equivalent direct and indirect benefits from the Federal Government to those granted to Newfoundland for its oil investments, including exclusion of its offshore revenues from equalization calculations;

THAT the National Assembly ask Federal MPs from Québec to argue the National Assembly of Québec's unanimous position before the Federal Government.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 52 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 30 minutes 20 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 21 minutes 40 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of his address, Mr. Arcand, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Rousseau be amended as follows:

By replacing, in the second paragraph, the words "call for an identical loan guarantee from the Federal Government covering the entire current and future debt incurred by Hydro-Québec for its hydroelectric and green energy projects;" by the words "demand fair, just and loyal treatment from the Federal Government for Québec for the development of energy projects";

By striking out the third paragraph;

By striking out the words "from Québec", in the fourth paragraph, after the words "Federal MPs", and by striking out, in the second line, the word "unanimous".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note the desire expressed by Québec's intergovernmental affairs minister to find a win-win solution to the dispute between Québec and Ottawa over the Federal Government's awarding of a loan guarantee covering the entire Muskrat Falls hydroelectric project; THAT the National Assembly demand fair, just and loyal treatment from the Federal Government for Québec for the development of energy projects;

THAT the National Assembly ask Federal MPs to argue the National Assembly of Québec's position before the Federal Government.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau) and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Arcand, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, subject to the permission of its author.

By leave of the Assembly, the amendment motion moved by Mr. Arcand, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, was withdrawn.

At the beginning of his address, Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Rousseau be amended as follows:

By replacing, in the first paragraph, the words "Québec's intergovernmental affairs minister" by the words "the Minister responsible for Canadian Relations":

By replacing, in the second paragraph, the words "call for an identical loan guarantee from the Federal Government covering the entire current and future debt incurred by Hydro-Québec for its hydroelectric and green energy projects" by the words "demand fair, just and loyal treatment from the Federal Government for Québec for the development of its energy works";

By striking out the third paragraph;

By striking out, in the 15th line, the word "unanimous".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note the desire expressed by the Minister responsible for Canadian Relations to find a winwin solution to the dispute between Québec and Ottawa over the Federal Government's awarding of a loan guarantee covering the entire Muskrat Falls hydroelectric project;

THAT the National Assembly demand fair, just and loyal treatment from the Federal Government for Québec for the development of its energy works;

THAT the National Assembly ask Federal MPs from Québec to argue the National Assembly of Québec's position before the Federal Government.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau) and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Mr. Marceau (Rousseau) accepted the amendments proposed by Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the amendment motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
