Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lisée, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mr. Fortin, Minister of Culture and Communications, Mr. Birnbaum (D'Arcy-McGee), Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly pay tribute to the life and exceptional work of Mr. Leonard Cohen;

THAT the Assembly underline this poet-singer-songwriter's enormous contribution to the cultural heritage of Québec and the world;

THAT it acknowledge his special attachment to the city of Montréal and to Québec, and his significant contribution to their visibility;

THAT the National Assembly express its most sincere condolences to the family and friends of Mr. Leonard Cohen;

THAT, lastly, the Members of the Assembly observe a minute of silence in his memory.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, moved a motion concerning the Société des alcools du Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for Small and Medium Enterprises, Regulatory Streamlining and Regional Economic Development, together with Mrs. Jean (Chicoutimi), Mr. Bonnardel, Second Opposition Group House Leader, and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly officially recognize Global Entrepreneurship Week, held from 14 to 20 November 2016:

THAT the Assembly highlight the important, invaluable contribution entrepreneurs make to the vitality of all of Québec's regional economies;

THAT it reiterate the key, leading role entrepreneurs play in creating jobs, wealth and economic growth;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly pay tribute to the audacity, innovation and creativity of the entrepreneurs whose activities highlight Québec know-how throughout the world.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. David (Gouin), together with Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved a motion concerning increasing the hourly minimum wage to \$15; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue and conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 109, An Act to grant Ville de Québec national capital status and increase its autonomy and powers;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 87, An Act to facilitate the disclosure of wrongdoings within public bodies.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

 the Committee on Labour and the Economy shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss its draft report and determine the observations, conclusions and recommendations, if any, concerning the process that led to the sale of RONA shares by Investissement Québec;

 the Committee on Public Finance shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of carrying out an order of initiative.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Motions

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 15 November 2016, on the motion that arose from the tabling of the Paris Agreement of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, on 8 November 2016, by Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT, pursuant to section 22.3 of the *Act respecting the Ministère des Relations internationales*, the National Assembly approve the Paris Agreement of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, this commitment was approved.

Government Bills

Adoption

Mr. Proulx, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, moved the passage of Bill 105, An Act to amend the Education Act.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

At 12.22 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) moved:

THAT the National Assembly mandate the Auditor General of Québec to audit the optimization of resources linked to the Société immobilière du Québec's sale of assets between 2003 and 2012;

THAT the Assembly also mandate the Auditor General of Québec to audit all contracts and agreements, including leases, entered into between Québec Government departments and bodies and Mr. Georges Gantcheff's companies.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 52 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 30 minutes 20 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 21 minutes 40 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of his address, Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, moved:

THAT the motion by the Member for La Peltrie be amended as follows:

By adding the following paragraph after the second paragraph: "THAT, lastly, as part of his audit and the publication of his report, the Auditor General of Québec ensure that police investigations currently underway are not compromised."

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly mandate the Auditor General of Québec to audit the optimization of resources linked to the Société immobilière du Québec's sale of assets between 2003 and 2012:

THAT the Assembly also mandate the Auditor General of Québec to audit all contracts and agreements, including leases, entered into between Québec Government departments and bodies and Mr. Georges Gantcheff's companies;

THAT, lastly, as part of his audit and the publication of his report, the Auditor General of Québec ensure that police investigations currently underway are not compromised.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, subject to the permission of its author.

At the end of her address, Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau) moved:

THAT the motion by the Member for La Peltrie be amended as follows:

By adding the following paragraph after the second paragraph: "THAT, lastly, it demand that the Government of Québec table, in the National Assembly, no later than 18 November 2016, the forensic accounting report commissioned by the Société immobilière du Québec on the sale of immovables, as well as any in-house investigation report on this subject."

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly mandate the Auditor General of Québec to audit the optimization of resources linked to the Société immobilière du Québec's sale of assets between 2003 and 2012;

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) refused the amendment proposed by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, and accepted the amendment proposed by Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, the divisions on the amendment motion moved by Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau) and on the motion moved by Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) were deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Private Members' Public Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Habel (Sainte-Rose) moved that Bill 693, An Act to amend the Act respecting the governance of state-owned enterprises to promote the presence of young people on the boards of directors of such enterprises, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 693 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 693 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.

Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 17 November 2016 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.
