Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 16 November 2016, on the motion moved by Mr. Proulx, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, for the passage of Bill 105, An Act to amend the Education Act.

17 November 2016

The motion was carried on the following vote:

(Division No. **259** in Appendix)

Yeas: **80** Nays: **16** Abstentions: **0**

Accordingly, Bill 105 was passed.

The Assembly took the divisions, which had been deferred at the sitting of 16 November 2016, on the motion moved by Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and on the amendment motion moved by Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

First, the question was put on the amendment motion moved by Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the motion by the Member for La Peltrie be amended as follows:

By adding the following paragraph after the second paragraph: “THAT, lastly, it demand that the Government of Québec table, in the National Assembly, no later than 18 November 2016, the forensic accounting report commissioned by the Société immobilière du Québec on the sale of immovables, as well as any in-house investigation report on this subject.”

The motion was negated on the following vote:

The question was then put on the motion moved by Mr. Caire (La Peltrie).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly mandate the Auditor General of Québec to audit the optimization of resources linked to the Société immobilière du Québec's sale of assets between 2003 and 2012;

THAT the Assembly also mandate the Auditor General of Québec to audit all contracts and agreements, including leases, entered into between Québec Government departments and bodies and Mr. Georges Gantcheff's companies.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), together with Mrs. Hivon (Joliette) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved a motion concerning the report on the administrative inquiry into the ruling to cancel the trial, for conspiracy to commit murder, of five Hells Angels from the Sherbrooke chapter and the report on the time involved in the legal proceedings; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Vien, Minister responsible for Labour, together with Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for the Status of Women, Mrs. Jean (Chicoutimi), Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

17 November 2016

THAT the National Assembly mark the 20th anniversary of the *Pay Equity Act*, passed unanimously on 21 November 1996;

THAT it recall that Québec is a leader in innovative policies on labour and gender equality issues;

THAT it recognize that the *Pay Equity Act* is a testament to social progress, recognizing women's work at its fair value;

THAT it reiterate that the purpose of the *Pay Equity Act* is to ensure that jobs traditionally or predominantly held by women are assigned the same remuneration as jobs traditionally or predominantly held by men. This is true even if the jobs are different, provided they are of comparable value within the same company;

THAT it highlight the fact that this anniversary provides an opportunity to applaud the work done and to spotlight the advances made by Québec society over the past 20 years;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly reaffirm that pay equity is, and will remain, a fundamental value within Québec society.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), together with Mr. Paradis (Lévis) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved a motion concerning the care, living conditions and staff ratio standards in residential and long-term care centres; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

17 November 2016

Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles) and Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), moved a motion concerning the labour dispute opposing the Government and public-sector attorneys and notaries; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 106, An Act to implement the 2030 Energy Policy and to amend various legislative provisions;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 87, An Act to facilitate the disclosure of wrongdoings within public bodies;
- the Committee on Institutions, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 113, An Act to amend the Civil Code and other legislative provisions as regards adoption and the disclosure of information;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 693, An Act to amend the Act respecting the governance of state-owned enterprises to promote the presence of young people on the boards of directors of such enterprises.
