Mr. Couillard, Premier, then tabled the following:

The question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was taken as required under section 104 of the *Act respecting Access to documents held by public bodies and the Protection of personal information*.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mr. Rochon (Richelieu), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to honour its commitments to promote the social acceptability of development projects on Québec territory;

THAT the Assembly urge the Minister of Energy and Natural Resources to incorporate respect for citizens' and Aboriginal peoples' rights into the implementation of government policy directions and the future action plan following consultations on the Green Paper on social acceptability released in February 2016.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

THAT, lastly, this motion become an order of the National Assembly.
