Introduction of Bills

Madam President communicated to the Assembly and then laid upon the Table the report from the Law Clerk on the following Private Bill:

225 An Act respecting lot 599 of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Polycarpe, registration division of Vaudreuil.

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred during Business Having Precedence at the sitting of 3 December 2002, on the motion moved by Mr. Charest, Leader of the Official Opposition. This motion reads as follows:

> THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Government of the Parti Québécois for its inability to meet the priorities of Quebecers as well as for its refusal to reduce the tax burden of Quebecers and to reinvest the required amounts to assure the quality and accessibility of public health, education and family support services.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, the Assembly immediately took certain notices of proceedings in committees.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Boisclair, Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Social Affairs, to continue its special consultations on Bill 113, An Act to amend the Act respecting health services and social services as regards the safe provision of health services and social services, and to hold special consultations on Bill 142, An Act to amend the Act respecting health services and social services as regards the medical activities, the distribution and the undertaking of physicians;
- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its special consultations on Bill 143, An Act to amend the Act respecting labour standards and other legislative provisions.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Roger Bertrand, Minister for Health, Social Services, Youth Protection and Prevention, moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark World AIDS Day, which was held on Sunday, 1 December 2002.

By leave of the Assembly under Standing Order 84, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate was held on the motion moved by Mr. Roger Bertrand, Minister for Health, Social Services, Youth Protection and Prevention, and carried without debate at the sitting of 3 December 2002, concerning the International Day for Disabled Persons.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Simard, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Institutions, to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 139, An Act to amend the Code of Penal Procedure;
- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to conclude its special consultations on Bill 129, Natural Heritage Conservation Act, and to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 115, An Act to amend the Highway Safety Code and the Act respecting the Ministère du Revenu;
- the Committee on Education, to conclude its special consultations on Bill 131, An Act to amend the Education Act as regards the school tax on the island of Montréal and amending other legislative provisions, and to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 124, An Act to amend the Act respecting the Conseil supérieur de l'éducation and the Education Act.

Mr. Beaulne, Second Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting for the purpose of completing the examination of the ninth report on the accountability of deputy ministers and chief executive officers of public bodies and to organize the Committee's proceedings.

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DIRECTIVE FROM THE CHAIR

Seeing that the Deputy Government House Leader convened four committees in the afternoon, Mr. Beaulne, Second Vice-President, referred to Standing Order 145, which provides that when the Assembly is in session, up to three committees may meet concurrently during the Orders of the Day. This Standing Order also states that when the Assembly is not in session, up to four committees may meet concurrently.

The convening of four committees by the Deputy Government House Leader is in order so long as the Assembly adjourns its proceedings before 3.00 o'clock p.m. If not, unless unanimous consent is given, the Government House Leader shall announce to the Assembly which of the four committees will not be sitting in the afternoon.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Facal, Minister responsible for Administration and the Public Service, Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved, –That Bill 141, An Act to amend the Act respecting the Pension Plan of Certain Teachers, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 141 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Simard, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 141 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Public Finance.

The motion was carried.

Passage

Mrs. Marois, Minister of Finance, the Economy and Research, moved the passage of Bill 107, An Act respecting the Agence nationale d'encadrement du secteur financier.

And debate arising;

During the debate, Mrs. Marois, Minister of Finance, the Economy and Research, moved that Bill 107 be referred to a Committee of the Whole for the consideration of amendments that she specified.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Simard, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that the Assembly then resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole.

The motion was carried.

The said amendments were considered and then carried in Committee of the Whole.

Bill 107, as amended, was reported to the Assembly, which concurred in the Committee's report.

And debate continuing on the motion for the passage of Bill 107;

Mrs. Jérôme-Forget (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) moved the adjournment of the debate.

The motion was carried.

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Mr. Simard, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 5 December 2002, at 10.00 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, at 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Beaulne, Second Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 5 December 2002, at 10.00 o'clock a.m.
