By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Lisée, Leader of the Official Opposition, tabled the following:

A copy of a report on an additional forensic accounting analysis of three real estate transactions of the Société immobilière du Québec dated 1 October 2013 entitled "Rapport d'expertise juricomptable – Société immobilière du Québec – Analyse de trois transactions immobilières (Complément de rapport) – Le 1^{er} octobre 2013".

At the request of the President, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 24 November 2016, on the motion moved by Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, that Bill 109, An Act to grant Ville de Québec national capital status and increase its autonomy and powers, pass in principle.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 96 Nays: 0 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 109 was passed in principle.

Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, moved that Bill 109 be referred to the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), together with Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved:

THAT the National Assembly reiterate the importance of preserving the beneficial consumer protection system enacted by the *Consumer Protection Act*;

THAT the Assembly demand that the Federal Government withdraw the provisions of Bill C-29, A second Act to implement certain provisions of the budget tabled in Parliament on March 22, 2016 and other measures, that would render *Consumer Protection Act* provisions governing the relation between banks and their customers inapplicable.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), together with Mrs. Hivon (Joliette) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), moved a motion concerning the Ombudsperson's 33 recommendations concerning the public compensation system for crime victims; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to continue and conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 102, An Act to amend the Environment Quality Act to modernize the environmental authorization scheme and to amend other legislative provisions, in particular to reform the governance of the Green Fund;
- the Committee on Institutions, to conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 113, An Act to amend the Civil Code and other legislative provisions as regards adoption and the disclosure of information;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to undertake clauseby-clause consideration of Bill 109, An Act to grant Ville de Québec national capital status and increase its autonomy and powers;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 92, An Act to extend the powers of the Régie de l'assurance maladie du Québec and to amend various legislative provisions;
- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 106, An Act to implement the 2030 Energy Policy and to amend various legislative provisions;

 the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 87, An Act to facilitate the disclosure of wrongdoings within public bodies.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 693, An Act to amend the Act respecting the governance of state-owned enterprises to promote the presence of young people on the boards of directors of such enterprises, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Roberge (Chambly).

The amendments to sections 1 and 1.2 were declared in order. The amendment to section 1.1 was declared out of order because it would have an effect that goes beyond the effect of the principle of Bill 693.

After debate thereon, the amendments were negatived.

The report was concurred in.
