By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Thériault, Deputy Premier, together with Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

> THAT the National Assembly express its solidarity with the families and friends of the victims of the attack near the Parliament and on Westminster Bridge in London on 22 March 2017;

> THAT it stress the incomprehensible, shocking nature of this crime, which has assaulted the very foundations of the United Kingdom's democratic, inclusive society;

> THAT it reaffirm its unwavering support to the British people at this tragic time that reminds us that, more than ever, we must remain united to fight the root causes of violence;

> THAT, lastly, the Members of the Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), together with Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly express its great disappointment at the Federal Government's 2017 budget, in particular for:

The lack of commitment to Québec's public transit projects: the express bus service, the metropolitan electric network (REM), the Montréal Metro's blue line; The lack of adequate support for the lumber industry; The lack of compensation for cheese producers; The lack of changes to tax treaties with Barbados.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
