# **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), together with Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion to hold a parliamentary committee on Mr. Marc-Yvan Côté's involvement in the Liberal Party leadership race; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Fortin, Minister of Culture and Communications, together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), Mrs. Samson (Iberville), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly honour the memory of Mr. Benoît Girard and Mrs. Janine Sutto, two great actors who had a far-reaching impact on Québec's cultural landscape and whose characters moved Quebecers for decades;

That the Assembly underline their indispensable role in developing Québec culture;

THAT, lastly, the Members of the Assembly observe a minute of silence in their memory.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

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Mr. Rochon (Richelieu), together with Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on Junex's divesting itself of licences to explore for hydrocarbons; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), together with Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on the metropolitan electric network (REM) project; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 and pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT the Committee on Institutions hold a general consultation and public hearings beginning on Wednesday, 16 August 2017 on the 2016 five-year report on administration of the *Act respecting Access to documents held by public bodies and the Protection of personal information* and the *Act respecting the protection of personal information in the private sector* entitled "Rétablir l'équilibre – Rapport sur l'application de la Loi sur l'accès aux documents des organismes publics et sur la protection des renseignements personnels et de la Loi sur la protection des renseignements personnels dans le secteur privé", tabled in the National Assembly on 29 September 2016 by the Minister responsible for Access to Information and the Reform of Democratic Institutions;

THAT all briefs and requests to be heard be received by the Committees Service no later than 1 June 2017;

THAT the Minister responsible for Access to Information and the Reform of Democratic Institutions be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

# **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committee:

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#### ORDERS OF THE DAY

#### **Business Having Precedence**

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly entered upon the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy.

At the end of his address, Mr. Marceau (Rousseau) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for cutting public services and increasing Quebecers' tax burden over the last three years and for tabling a budget proposing partial reinvestment in these services and incomplete reimbursement to Quebecers.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, and on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), subject to the receivability of this motion.

At the request of Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

At the end of his address, Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for having considerably increased the tax burden on Québec families since beginning its term in office.

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At 12.42 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings.

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The proceedings resumed at 12.47 o'clock p.m.

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Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 6 hours 25 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government, including the Budget Speech; 3 hours 47 minutes 51 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, including the comments made by its representative on 28 March 2017 and his address during today's proceedings; 2 hours 37 minutes 9 seconds to the Second Opposition Group, including the comments made by its representative on 28 March 2017 and his address during today's proceedings; 20 minutes to the Member for Mercier and the Member for Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques; and 10 minutes each to the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau) and Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of her address, Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec censure the Liberal Government for its 2017–2018 budget, which postpones seriously beginning the transition to greater energy efficiency and more environment-friendly methods, which favours the metropolitan electric network (REM) project to the detriment of real public transit needs and which jeopardizes the goal of achieving Québec's greenhouse gas emission reduction targets for 2020 and 2030.

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At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly resumed the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of her speech, Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for cutting public services over the last three years while continuing to give hundreds of millions of dollars to physicians.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) and Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of his speech, Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for cutting public services over the last three years under the pretext of a fictitious \$7 billion deficit.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles) and Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of his address, Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for not providing the resource regions with the necessary means, in its 2017–2018 budget, to enable them to enhance their economic and social development throughout their territory as a whole.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie—Saint-Jacques), Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of his speech, Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for not significantly increasing funding for independent community action organizations in its 2017–2018 budget.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie—Saint-Jacques), Mrs. Léger (Pointe-aux-Trembles), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque) and Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the request of Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, the proceedings continued beyond 6.00 o'clock p.m.

At the end of his address, Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its unjustified cuts over the last three years, particularly in health, social services and education, which will have serious, unfortunate and irreversible consequences for our children, seniors and the most vulnerable members of our society. And that the Assembly also censure the Liberal Government for eliminating any trace of humanitarianism in its choice of actions.

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At 6.01 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 4 April 2017 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
