The Assembly was called to order at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque), together with Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on the Patriote flag in the context of National Patriots' Day; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel), together with Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on the Saint-Joseph-du-Lac landfill site; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Proulx, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports and Minister of Families, together with Mr. Cousineau (Bertrand), Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark International Day of Families, observed every 15 May, whose theme this year is "Families, education and well-being";

THAT the Assembly recognize the importance of supporting families to promote the well-being of all family members and ensure children's overall development and academic success:

THAT the Assembly highlight the fundamental role that families and Québec's Family Policy play in children's education, beginning in early childhood and continuing throughout their lives;

THAT the Assembly express its desire to support parents, in particular by promoting best practices in reconciling the demands of family, school and work to make it easier for them to balance all spheres of their lives.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committee:

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 20, 143, 296, 297 and 298, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that after Routine Proceedings on Wednesday, 17 May 2017, Mr. Cousineau (Bertrand) would question Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister responsible for the Laurentides region, for a period of 2 hours, during an interpellation on the lack of Liberal Government leadership for the Basses-Laurentides region.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Debates on Reports from Committees

Pursuant to the order adopted by the Assembly on 10 May 2017, the Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance, which held public hearings on 30 September, on 17 and 18 November 2015, on 12 and 19 May and on 15 September 2016 within the framework of special consultations on the tax haven phenomenon. The report contains observations, conclusions and 38 recommendations.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 56 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 33 minutes 26 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes 4 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Second Opposition Group; and 7 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum, based on the number of Members who indicated their intention to speak, of 2 minutes each for the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes for the two Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.

At 1.15 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Pursuant to the order adopted on 10 May 2017, Mr. Lamontagne (Johnson) moved:

THAT the National Assembly endorse the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec's position opposing the advisory resolution on Bombardier executive officers' remuneration.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 51 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 30 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 21 minutes to the Second Opposition Group; and 7 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum, based on the number of Members who indicated their intention to speak, of 2 minutes each for the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes for the two Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

11 May 2017

A debate arose thereon.

At the request of Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, Mr. Lamontagne (Johnson) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

Passage in Principle

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Laframboise (Blainville).

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel) to Mr. D'Amour, Minister for Maritime Affairs and Minister responsible for the Bas-Saint-Laurent region, about the compensation situation for flood victims in Pohénégamook.

At 6.13 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 16 May 2017 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
