THAT the National Assembly mark the achievements of the Québec athletes who participated in the Special Olympics World Winter Games held in Austria in March 2017; THAT the Assembly applaud the outstanding performances that won our athletes 22 medals, including 10 golds. Through their athletic feats and determination, they are models of success and a source of inspiration for their peers, for those coming up after them and for the Québec public as a whole:

THAT, lastly, the Assembly wish these athletes the best of success for the Special Olympics Québec Summer Games, to be held in Québec City from 29 June to 2 July 2017.
