#### **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 7 June 2017, on the motion moved by Mr. Lessard, Minister of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification, that Bill 137, An Act respecting the Réseau électrique métropolitain, pass in principle.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 83 Nays: 28 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 137 was passed in principle.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 137 be referred to the Committee on Transportation and the Environment for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

## **Motions Without Notice**

Mrs. Lamarre (Taillon), together with Mr. Paradis (Lévis), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion concerning the absence of emergency room physicians; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), together with Mr. Bourcier (Saint-Jérôme), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion concerning Bill 796, An Act to amend the Act respecting labour standards to facilitate informal caregiving; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Blais, Minister responsible for the Capitale-Nationale region, together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underscore the vision and talent of the founders of the Festival d'été de Québec (Quebec City summer festival): Mrs. Diane Lavoie, Mrs. Constance Paré, Mrs. Hélène Savoie, Mrs. Hélène Trépanier, Mr. Bernard Pelchat, Mr. Louis Richard and Mr. Michel Viel; THAT it pay tribute to these individuals in recognition of their commitment and outstanding contribution to our capital's cultural and international visibility on the festival's 50th anniversary;

Lastly, that it applaud Mr. Daniel Gélinas' contribution as a "builder" furthering the festival as well as that of the organization's current members, who continue to apply their passion and expertise to developing this exceptional showcase for artists from Québec and elsewhere.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.
