Mr. Gautrin (Verdun) moved:

Estimates of Expenditure

Supplementary Estimates

On the motion by Mr. Boulerice, Deputy Government House Leader, the Assembly resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to resume the consideration of the Supplementary Estimates # 1 for the fiscal year ending 31 March 2001.

Consideration in Committee of the Whole

Pursuant to the order adopted on Friday, 8 December 2000, the Committee of the Whole resumed the consideration of the Supplementary Estimates # 1 for the fiscal year ending 31 March 2001.

At 1.20 o'clock p.m., Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.04 o'clock p.m.

Consideration in Committee of the Whole

Pursuant to the order adopted on Friday, 8 December 2000, the Committee of the Whole continued the consideration of the Supplementary Estimates # 1 for the fiscal year ending 31 March 2001.

With the permission of Mr. Brouillet, Chairman of the Committee of the Whole, Mrs. Marois, Minister of State for Health and Social Services, tabled the following:

A table indicating the allowances given to the youth centres.

A table, per region and per establishment, indicating the distribution of \$200,000,000 in supplementary estimates granted for equipment.

The consideration being concluded, the Supplementary Estimates # 1 for the 2000-2001 fiscal year were concurred in on division, following a recorded division (standing vote).

The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole reported to the Assembly as follows:

The Committee of the Whole has concurred in the Supplementary Estimates # 1 and the Government may take out of the consolidated revenue fund a sum not exceeding \$415,000,000.00 to defray a part of the expenses of Québec proposed in the Supplementary Estimates for the fiscal year 2000-2001 as laid before the National Assembly, not otherwise provided for, being the amount of each of the estimates to be voted for various programmes set forth in the Schedule to the Bill to be introduced hereafter.

The question was put on this report; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The report was carried on the following vote:

Mr. Léonard, Minister for Administration and the Public Service, Chairman of the Conseil du Trésor, introduced Bill 176, Appropriation Act No. 4, 2000-2001, and moved:

THAT the Bill be brought before the Assembly;

THAT the Bill do pass in principle;

THAT the Bill do pass.

The question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 64 Nays: 41 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 176, Appropriation Act No. 4, 2000-2001, was passed.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Culture on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 171, An Act to amend the Charter of the French language.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in on division.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Chevrette, Minister of Transport, moved, —That Bill 172, An Act to amend the Highway Safety Code and the Automobile Insurance Act, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 172 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mr. Boisclair, Deputy Government House Leader, Bill 172 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Transportation and the Environment.

Passage

Mr. Chevrette, Minister of Transport, moved the passage of Bill 164, An Act respecting transport infrastructure partnerships.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 164 was passed.

Resuming the debate on the motion by Mr. Chevrette, Minister responsible for Wildlife and Parks, for the passage of Bill 152, An Act to amend the Act respecting the conservation and development of wildlife and the Act respecting hunting and fishing rights in the James Bay and New Québec territories;

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 152 was passed.

Passage in Principle

Mrs. Goupil, Minister responsible for the administration of legislation respecting the professions, moved, —That Bill 169, An Act to amend the Professional Code and other legislative provisions as regards the carrying on of professional activities within a partnership or company, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 169 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mr. Boisclair, Deputy Government House Leader, Bill 169 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Institutions.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 146, An Act to amend the Act respecting school elections and the Election Act.
