The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of Tuesday, 28 November 2000, on the motion by Mr. Boisclair, Minister of Social Solidarity, for the passage of Bill 102, An Act to amend the Supplemental Pension Plans Act and other legislative provisions (*modified title*).

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 64 Nays: 42 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 102 was passed.

Motions Without Notice

Mrs. Beauchamp (Sauvé) moved a motion concerning Bill 170, An Act to reform the municipal territorial organization of the metropolitan regions of Montréal, Québec and the Outaouais; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Boisclair, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 170, An Act to reform the municipal territorial organization of the metropolitan regions of Montréal, Québec and the Outaouais;
- -- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 144, An Act respecting La Financière agricole du Québec;
- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 164, An Act respecting transport infrastructure partnerships.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Resuming the debate on the motion by Mr. Chevrette, Minister of Transport, -That Bill 163, An Act respecting transportation services by taxi, do now pass in principle;

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Bissonnet, Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.03 o'clock p.m.

Passage in Principle

And debate continuing on the motion by Mr. Chevrette, Minister of Transport, -That Bill 163, An Act respecting transportation services by taxi, do now pass in principle;

During his address, Mr. Sirros (Laurier-Dorion) moved the following motion to divide the said Bill:

THAT, pursuant to Standing Order 241, Bill 163, An Act respecting transportation services by taxi, be divided into two Bills, the first of which shall be entitled "An Act respecting transportation services by taxi" and shall comprise sections 1 to 70 and 74 to 140, and the second of which shall be entitled "An Act to establish the Forum des intervenants de l'industrie du taxi" and shall comprise sections 71 to 73, 133, 137, 139 and 140 up to the word "Government" in the second line of the said section.

At 4.20 o'clock p.m., after having heard arguments from both sides regarding the receivability of this motion, Mr. Brouillet, Vice-President, took the matter under advisement.

At 4.55 o'clock p.m., after a suspension of the proceedings, Mr. Brouillet, Vice-President, rendered the following decision:

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

The motion is receivable. Bill 163 comprises no less than the two principles identified in the motion to divide. Furthermore, each of the two principles identified constitutes more than mere terms and may be considered individually. Finally, the bill may be divided in such a manner so as to form two separate and coherent bills, which would be complete and independent in themselves.

After a brief suspension of the proceedings during which he met with the House leaders, Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, announced the allocation of speaking time for the limited debate on this motion: five minutes shall be set aside for the independent Member; the two parliamentary groups shall equally share the rest of the time allotted for this debate; within this framework, any time not used by a parliamentary group or by the independent Member may be redistributed, and individual addresses shall not be limited.

The Assembly entered upon the limited debate on the motion to divide moved by Mr. Sirros.

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 8.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 8.02 o'clock p.m.

Passage in Principle

And debate continuing on the motion to divide Bill 163 moved by Mr. Sirros (Laurier-Dorion);

Mr. Boulerice, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the debate, pursuant to Standing Order 100.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 94 Nays: 0 Abstentions: 0

Mrs. Maltais, Minister of Culture and Communications, moved, –That Bill 160, An Act respecting the Bibliothèque nationale du Québec and amending various legislative provisions, do now pass in principle. After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and Bill 160 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mr. Boulerice, Deputy Government House Leader, carried on division, Bill 160 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Culture.

Resuming the debate on the motion by Mr. Cliche, Minister for the Information Highway and Government Services, –That Bill 161, An Act to establish a legal framework for information technology, do now pass in principle;

At 11.59 o'clock p.m., the debate on the motion by Mr. Cliche was adjourned. Mr. Bissonnet, Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 30 November 2000, at 10.00 o'clock a.m.
