The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 18 October 2017, on the motion moved by Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Public Security, for the passage of Bill 133, An Act to make wearing of the uniform by police officers and special constables mandatory in the performance of their duties and respecting the exclusivity of duties of police officers who hold a managerial position (*modified title*).

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 133 was passed.

Motions Without Notice

Mrs. Lavallée (Repentigny), together with Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion to hold a parliamentary committee on child prostitution; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice, together with Mrs. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the second Journée nationale sur la justice participative, held today, 19 October 2017;

THAT, on this day, the Assembly raise citizens' awareness of alternatives to mainstream justice processes that help improve access to justice for all Quebecers.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), together with Mr. Chevarie (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec ask the Federal Government to remove the Cap-aux-Meules/Souris ferry from an eventual call for tenders aimed at privatizing this service that is vital to the Magdalen Islands and that Transport Canada negotiate a long-term contract with the CTMA cooperative, as ferry operator.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

THAT the Member for Orford be named a permanent member of the Committee on Labour and the Economy in substitution for the Member for Saint-François;

THAT these changes take effect immediately.
