Complaints of Breach of Privilege or Contempt and Personal Explanations

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that he had, within the prescribed time, received a request from Mr. Bérubé, Official Opposition House Leader, to be heard on a matter of breach of privilege or contempt.

In his notice, the Official Opposition House Leader alleges that, on 19 September 2017, the Minister of Justice acted in contempt of Parliament through remarks she made during the clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 62, An Act to foster adherence to State religious neutrality and, in particular, to provide a framework for requests for accommodations on religious grounds in certain bodies (*modified title*), and that these remarks deliberately mislead parliamentarians.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that he would hear arguments in the 26 October 2017 sitting, during Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly.

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. D'Amour, Minister for Maritime Affairs, together with Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), Mr. Martel (Nicolet-Bécancour), Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 17th edition of Québec Marine Day, whose theme is "Ship differently + efficiently";

THAT it recognize the marine industry's strategic importance as a factor in Québec's economic and social development.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), together with Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion concerning the obligation to uncover one's face in dealings with the State; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Martel (Nicolet-Bécancour), together with Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask that, in the event of termination of office, Members undertake to ensure proper transfer of files to their successor, in the best interests of the citizens of their riding.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly congratulate the organizers and artists of the show tour to raise funds to rebuild the Théâtre de la Vieille Forge, which was razed by fire on 15 August 2017;

THAT it recognize the importance of this cultural institution, which is at the heart of the Festival en chanson de Petite-Vallée, and acknowledge the significant loss for the cultural community, the citizens of Gaspésie and Québec as a whole;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec Government to financially support reconstruction of the Théâtre de la Vieille Forge.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Pursuant to the consent given by the Assembly on 19 October 2017, Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion concerning the crucifix decorating the National Assembly Chamber; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 and pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, within the framework of the consideration of Bill 148, An Act to regulate generic medication procurement by owner pharmacists and to amend various legislative provisions, the Committee on Health and Social Services hold special consultations and public hearings on 7 and 8 November 2017 in the Legislative Council Room;

THAT, for this purpose, it hear the following:

THAT the presentation by each individual or organization last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 50 minutes, allocated as follows: 25 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 15 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and 10 minutes to the Second Opposition Group;

THAT the Minister of Health and Social Services be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Pursuant to Standing Order 129, Mrs. Poirier, Chief Official Opposition Whip, moved:

THAT the Member for Bonaventure be named a permanent member of the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources;

THAT this change take effect immediately.

The motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Institutions, to continue and conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 107, An Act to increase the jurisdiction and independence of the Anti-Corruption Commissioner and the Bureau des enquêtes indépendantes and expand the power of the Director of Criminal and Penal Prosecutions to grant certain benefits to cooperating witnesses;
- the Committee on Culture and Education, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 144, An Act to amend the Education Act and other legislative provisions concerning mainly free educational services and compulsory school attendance.

And, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, he convened the following committee:

the Committee on Citizen Relations, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 143, An Act to improve the educational quality and foster the harmonious development of educational childcare services; then, conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 134, An Act mainly to modernize rules relating to consumer credit and to regulate debt settlement service contracts, high-cost credit contracts and loyalty programs.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 25 October 2017 during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Caire (La Peltrie).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT Bill 992, An Act to amend the Public Administration Act and other legislative provisions to make deputy ministers and chief executive officers accountable for their government department's or public body's efficiency, do pass in principle.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, moved that Bill 139, An Act to group the Office Québec/Wallonie-Bruxelles pour la jeunesse, the Office Québec-Amériques pour la jeunesse and the Office Québec-Monde pour la jeunesse, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 139 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 139 be referred to the Committee on Institutions for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

At 3.36 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

Debates upon Adjournment

At 6.02 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held two debates upon adjournment:

- the first, on a question from Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau) to Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice, about contradictory statements made by the Minister during the clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 62, An Act to foster adherence to State religious neutrality and, in particular, to provide a framework for requests for accommodations on religious grounds in certain bodies (*modified title*);
- the second, on a question from Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes) to Mrs. Tremblay, Minister for Transport, about the awarding of an untendered contract to Air Inuit. Mr. Arcand, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Ongoing Program Review and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, replaced the Minister for this debate.

At 6.28 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7.30 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 7.30 o'clock p.m.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Health and Social Services on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 130, An Act to amend certain provisions regarding the clinical organization and management of health and social services institutions, together with the amendments transmitted by Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean) and Mr. Paradis (Lévis).

The amendments were declared in order, except the amendment proposed by Mr. Paradis (Lévis) to section 1 of the bill, which was declared out of order because it proposes adding an obligation to coordinate fundraising activities carried out by the health and social services institutions and foundations attached to them. The Standing Orders provide that amendments must be relevant to the subject matter of a bill and must not reverse its principle or add new ones. The proposed amendment exceeds the scope of the original section and the bill as a whole. It was therefore declared out of order.

At 7.32 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes to confer with the House leaders to organize putting the question on the proposed amendments.

The proceedings resumed at 7.35 o'clock p.m.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the amendments to sections 7 and 63.1 proposed by Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), on questions put thereon, were negatived.

The amendment to section 37 proposed by Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), on questions put thereon, was negatived.

The amendments proposed by Mr. Paradis (Lévis), on questions put severally thereon, were negatived.

The report was concurred in on division.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Wednesday, 25 October 2017 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, at 8.15 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Wednesday, 25 October 2017 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.
