By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, and on behalf of Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice, together with Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark International Human Rights Day, observed annually on 10 December since the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights by the United Nations General Assembly on 10 December 1948;

THAT it recall that the Government of Québec declared itself bound by the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and its protocol and by the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights on 21 April 1976;

THAT the National Assembly recall that, this year, International Day of Human Rights kicks off a year of events marking the upcoming celebration of the 70th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, a milestone document that proclaimed inalienable rights which everyone is inherently entitled to as a human being, regardless of race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status; THAT, lastly, the National Assembly reiterate its commitment to promoting human rights and respect of the rule of law and of democracy, peace, solidarity and tolerance. That it further recall that the Universal Declaration of Human Rights makes each of us accountable and that the principles enshrined in it are just as relevant today as they were in 1948.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Lisée, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin) and Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), moved a motion on selecting candidates for immigration to Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) moved a motion on interprovincial free trade; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), moved:

THAT the National Assembly use International Anti-Corruption Day, 9 December 2017, to highlight the importance of fighting corruption in all its forms;

THAT it recognize that corruption is one of the most detrimental, persistent scourges worldwide and that its consequences are disastrous, diminishing quality of life, increasing poverty and undermining public confidence; THAT it note how vital it is that Quebecers trust their public institutions in the way they conduct state business and in government dealings with enterprises;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate the importance of improving our governance systems and tools in matters of ethics and professional conduct so as to eliminate corruption and its effects in all spheres of society;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to actively pursue its anti-corruption initiatives by promoting integrity, accountability and good management of public affairs in accordance with the United Nations Convention against Corruption.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

#### **ORDERS OF THE DAY**

**Government Bills** 

#### Passage

Mr. Poëti, Minister for Integrity in Public Procurement and for Information Resources, moved the passage of Bill 135, An Act to reinforce the governance and management of the information resources of public bodies and government enterprises.

A debate arose thereon.

During the debate, Mr. Poëti, Minister for Integrity in Public Procurement and for Information Resources, moved that Bill 135 be referred to a Committee of the Whole for consideration of the amendment that he specified.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that the Assembly resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole.

The motion was carried.

Committee of the Whole

The amendment to Bill 135 proposed by Mr. Poëti, Minister for Integrity in Public Procurement and for Information Resources, was considered in Committee of the Whole.

The amendment was carried.

Bill 135, as amended, was reported to the Assembly, which concurred in the report of the Committee of the Whole.

The debate continued on the motion for the passage of Bill 135.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 135 was passed.

# Passage

Mrs. Vallée, Minister of Justice, informed the Assembly that the Honourable J. Michel Doyon, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended the passage of Bill 154, An Act to implement certain recommendations of the report of the committee on the remuneration of judges for 2016–2019. She then moved the passage of the bill.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 154 was accordingly passed.

At 12.39 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 21, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Passage

Mrs. David, Minister responsible for Higher Education, moved the passage of Bill 151, An Act to prevent and fight sexual violence in higher education institutions.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Fortin, Minister of Families, moved the passage of Bill 143, An Act to improve the educational quality and foster the harmonious development of educational childcare services.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

# **Debates on Reports from Committees**

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Administration, which met on 27 September, on 4 and 18 October and on 1 November 2017 to hear deputy ministers and heads of public bodies on Chapter 3 of the Auditor General of Québec's spring 2017 report on contaminated land rehabilitation, entitled "Réhabilitation des terrains contaminés", the administrative management and financial commitments of the Ministère du Tourisme, the follow-up to recommendation 1.4 of the 35th report of the Committee on Public Administration, the follow-up to recommendation 7.1 of the 33rd report of the Committee on Public Administration, and Chapter 2 of the Auditor General of Québec's spring 2017 report on Autorité des marchés financiers control activities, entitled "Autorité des marchés financiers". The report contains observations, conclusions and 9 recommendations.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 55 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 26 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes 34 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Second Opposition Group; and 10 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum, based on the number of Members who indicated their intention to speak, of 2 minutes each for the Member for Gaspé, the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes to the three Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) tabled the following:

A copy of a document entitled "Committee on Public Administration: 20 Years of Progress in Accountability in Québec".

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.
