Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 21 March 2018, on the motion moved by Mrs. Thériault, Minister responsible for Consumer Protection and for Housing, for the passage in principle of Bill 162, An Act to amend the Building Act and other legislative provisions mainly to give effect to certain Charbonneau Commission recommendations.

Accordingly, Bill 162 was passed in principle.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 162 be referred to the Committee on Labour and the Economy for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), together with Mr. Leclair (Beauharnois), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin) and Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), moved a motion on Bill 176, An Act to amend the Act respecting labour standards and other legislative provisions mainly to facilitate family-work balance; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, within the framework of the consideration of Bill 173, An Act mainly to introduce a basic income for persons with a severely limited capacity for employment, the Committee on Labour and the Economy hold special consultations and public hearings on 10, 11 and 12 April 2018;

Mrs. Ruth Rose, Associate Professor, Department of Economic Sciences, and Member of the Institut de recherche et d'études féministes, UQAM;

THAT a period of 12 minutes be set aside for opening statements, allocated as follows: 6 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 3 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and 2 minutes 30 seconds to the Second Opposition Group;

THAT the presentation by each individual or organization last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 35 minutes, allocated as follows: 17 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 10 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and 7 minutes to the Second Opposition Group;

THAT the Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), together with Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin) and Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), moved a motion on Québec's school network; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), together with Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), moved a motion on the municipalities' right to derogate from the *Water Withdrawal and Protection Regulation*; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 141, An Act mainly to improve the regulation of the financial sector, the protection of deposits of money and the operation of financial institutions;

- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 155, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning municipal affairs and the Société d'habitation du Québec;

— the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 157, An Act to constitute the Société québécoise du cannabis, to enact the Cannabis Regulation Act and to amend various highway safety-related provisions.

And, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, he convened the following Committee:

— the Committee on Institutions, to continue and conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 128, An Act to promote the protection of persons by establishing a framework with regard to dogs.

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a deliberative meeting to prepare special consultations and public hearings within the framework of the examination of petitions on introducing and implementing a Lyme disease action plan; then, hold a public meeting to hold these special consultations and public hearings;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining certain petitions and carrying out an order of initiative.
