Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Martel (Nicolet-Bécancour), together with Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion on the lockout at the Université du Québec à Trois-Rivières; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Couillard, Premier, together with Mr. Lisée, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved:

THAT the Assembly mark Québec Sports and Physical Activity Day, which takes place on 3 May 2018;

THAT it also use this occasion to highlight the remarkable achievements of the athletes who participated in the PyeongChang Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games;

THAT it recognize the families' investment, the coaches' outstanding work, the volunteers' generosity and the officials' rigour, and that it thank the sports organizations for supporting the athletes and teams as they strive for the best possible performances;

THAT the Assembly affirm that their determination, passion and talent are worthy of mention and constitute a source of inspiration for all Quebecers.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), together with Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin) and Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé), moved a motion on the Canada-U.S. Safe Third Country Agreement; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), together with Mr. Traversy (Terrebonne), Mrs. Samson (Iberville), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), moved a motion on freedom of the press and the transparency of the public authorities; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to undertake and continue clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 173, An Act mainly to introduce a basic income for persons with a severely limited capacity for employment;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 157, An Act to constitute the Société québécoise du cannabis, to enact the Cannabis Regulation Act and to amend various highway safety-related provisions;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 141, An Act mainly to improve the regulation of the financial sector, the protection of deposits of money and the operation of financial institutions:
- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to hold its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 178, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning consumer protection.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Friday, 11 May 2018, Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet) would question Mr. Fortin, Minister of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification, during an interpellation on the Réseau électrique métropolitain as a Liberal Government project that benefits the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec, not the population.

Estimates of Expenditure

Estimates of the National Assembly

On the motion moved by Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, and pursuant to Standing Order 286, the Assembly resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to examine the estimates of expenditure for the National Assembly for the 2018–2019 fiscal year.

Committee of the Whole

Mr. Ouimet, Chair of the Committee of the Whole, informed the Committee that the period allotted for examination of the estimates shall not exceed 2 hours 12 minutes and that the speaking time shall be allotted as follows: 20 minutes to the President for his opening remarks; 56 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 30 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 20 minutes to the Second Opposition Group and 6 minutes to the Members of Québec solidaire.

The Committee of the Whole undertook examination of the estimates of expenditure for the National Assembly.

With the permission of Mr. Ouimet, Chair of the Committee of the Whole, Mr. Gaudreault, Chief Official Opposition Whip, tabled the following:

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 18 April 2018, on the motion moved by Mr. Poëti, Minister for Integrity in Public Procurement and for Information Resources, that Bill 171, An Act to enact the Act respecting the implementation of the Canadian Free Trade Agreement and to bring measures relating to contracting by public bodies into compliance with that agreement, the Trade and Cooperation Agreement between Ontario and Québec and the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement between Canada and the European Union and its Member States, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 171 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 171 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Public Security, moved that Bill 170, An Act to modernize the legal regime applicable to liquor permits and to amend various other legislative provisions with regard to alcoholic beverages, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 170 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 170 be referred to the Committee on Institutions for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.	

Mrs. Vien, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Tuesday, 8 May 2018 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
