The Assembly was called to order at 9.41 o'clock a.m.

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. Therrien (Sanguinet) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier), together with Mr. Lemay (Masson), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on controlled zones (ZEC); this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Jolin-Barrette (Borduas), together with Mr. Pagé (Labelle), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Federal Government recognize Québec's autonomy regarding cannabis regulation on its territory.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Coiteux, Minister of Public Security, together with Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), Mr. Spénard (Beauce-Nord), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 11th Civil Protection Week, held 6 to 12 May to raise public awareness about the importance of being properly prepared to face a variety of emergency situations;

THAT it highlight the important work done by the first responders and emergency services that intervene during such disasters.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mr. Schneeberger (Drummond–Bois-Francs), Mr. Lelièvre (Gaspé) and Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), moved a motion on taking child support payments into account in calculating social assistance benefits; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Institutions, to undertake clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 170, An Act to modernize the legal regime applicable to liquor permits and to amend various other legislative provisions with regard to alcoholic beverages;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 141, An Act mainly to improve the regulation of the financial sector, the protection of deposits of money and the operation of financial institutions;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 157, An Act to constitute the Société québécoise du cannabis, to enact the Cannabis Regulation Act and to amend various highway safety-related provisions;

— the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 152, An Act to amend various labour-related legislative provisions mainly to give effect to certain Charbonneau Commission recommendations.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 162, An Act to amend the Building Act and other legislative provisions mainly to give effect to certain Charbonneau Commission recommendations.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 171, An Act to enact the Act respecting the implementation of the Canadian Free Trade Agreement and to bring measures relating to contracting by public bodies into compliance with that agreement, the Trade and Cooperation Agreement between Ontario and Québec and the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement between Canada and the European Union and its Member States.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

At 11.38 o'clock a.m., at the request of Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.02 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

On behalf of Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), Mr. Nadeau-Dubois (Gouin) moved:

THAT Bill 1190, An Act to establish gender-balanced representation among Cabinet Ministers, pass in principle.

Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; approximately 45 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 25 minutes 43 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 19 minutes 17 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; and 20 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum, based on the number of Members who indicated their intention to speak, of 2 minutes each for the Member for Gaspé, the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 16 minutes to the three Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

After debate thereon, the question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Accordingly, the principle of Bill 1190 was rejected.
