ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Fortin, Minister of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification, moved that Bill 184, An Act to promote the establishment of a public fast-charging service for electric vehicles, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried, and Bill 184 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Tanguay, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 184 be referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Debates on Reports from Committees

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Citizen Relations, which held public hearings on 6 and 7 December 2017 within the framework of special consultations on the order of initiative on women's place in politics. The report contains observations, conclusions and seven recommendations.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 55 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 26 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 23 minutes 34 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Second Opposition Group; and 10 minutes to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each for the Member for Gaspé, the Member for Groulx and the Member for Vachon, and 6 minutes to the Members of Québec solidaire. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

7 June 2018

A debate arose thereon.
