**Deferred Divisions** 

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred during Government Motions at the sitting of 6 May 1999, on the motion moved by Mrs. Goupil, Minister of Justice. This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly:

- CONCUR in the position and justifications given by the Government and stipulated in the document tabled on 5 May 1999 by the Minister of Justice; and
- Concerning the Court of Québec judges and the Laval, Montréal and Québec municipal court judges:
- APPROVE Recommendations 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 10 of the Report from the Comité de la rémunération des juges which was tabled in the National Assembly on 21 October 1998 and whose sessional paper number is 1880-981021;
- AMEND Recommendation 1 of the Comité so as to set the annual salary at \$118,032 as from 1 July 1998, at \$120,393 as from 1 July 1999, and at \$122,801 as from 1 July 2000;
- APPROVE Recommendation 4 of the Comité on the basis of the annual salaries provided for in this motion;
- APROVE Recommendation 9 of the Comité by increasing from \$800 to \$1000 the amount of the allowance as of 1 July 1998;
- 2) Concerning the municipal court judges who come under the *Act respecting municipal courts*:
- APPROVE Recommendations 3, 4, 5 and 6 of the Report from the aid Comité, which was tabled in the National Assembly on 21 October 1998 and whose sessional paper number is 1880-981021;
