Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, together with Mr. Ciccone (Marquette), Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 15th edition of the Health Challenge, which will run 1 to 30 April 2019.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), together with Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on Québec's bid to host the COP26; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Mr. Polo (Laval-des-Rapides), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that the 2030 Québec Energy Policy action plan tabled by the previous government provided for setting a 5% minimum renewable natural gas (RNG) threshold in the distribution networks in 2017;

THAT the National Assembly note that the new regulation announced yesterday by the Minister of Energy and Natural Resources sets the 2020 minimum threshold at 1% and the 2025 minimum threshold at 5%.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Mrs. Richard (Duplessis), together with Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine), Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the position of Commissioner of the Unité permanente anticorruption; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 1, An Act to amend the rules governing the appointment and dismissal of the Anti-Corruption Commissioner, the Director General of the Sûreté du Québec and the Director of Criminal and Penal Prosecutions;
- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 10, An Act to amend the Pay Equity Act mainly to improve the pay equity audit process.

 the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining an order of initiative.

Business Having Precedence

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly entered upon the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, that the Assembly approve the Government's budgetary policy.

At the end of his address, Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government for its budget, which will result in the loss of \$600 million over four years by liquidating much of the Generations Fund.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, interrupted the debate to inform the Assembly that he had received a request for a debate upon adjournment to be held on Thursday, 28 March 2019 on a question from Mrs. Thériault (Anjou-Louis-Riel) to Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, on the CAQ Government's promise to drop the RénoVert program in its budget.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, and on the motion stating a grievance moved by Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin), subject to the receivability of this motion.

At the end of his speech, Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Coalition avenir Québec Government for its Québec Infrastructure Plan, which reduces the ratio of public transit investments to highway transportation investments.

Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 6 hours 37 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government, including the Budget Speech; 4 hours 9 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, including the comments made by its critic on 21 March 2019 and his address during today's proceedings; 1 hour 22 minutes 49 seconds to the Second Opposition Group, including the comments made by its critic on 21 March 2019 and his address during today's proceedings; 1 hour 14 minutes 32 seconds to the Third Opposition Group, including the comments made by its critic on 21 March 2019 and its Leader's address during today's proceedings; 15 minutes jointly to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 7 minutes 30 seconds each. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate continued.

At the end of his speech, Mr. Arcand, Leader of the Official Opposition, moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government for its 2019–2020 budget, which does not take into account the significant leeway inherited from the previous government, contains no vision and abandons future generations.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont) and Mr. Arcand, Leader of the Official Opposition, subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of his speech, Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Government for not committing, in its 2019–2020 budget, to undertake new energy-efficient social housing unit construction projects under the AccèsLogis Program.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Arcand, Leader of the Official Opposition, and Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of his speech, Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ Government for its complete lack of vision with respect to development of the blue economy and maritime Québec.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Arcand, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 28 March 2019 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.
