Accordingly, Bill 2 was passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 2 be referred to the Committee on Health and Social Services for clause-by-clause consideration.

Motions Without Notice

Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), together with Mrs. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Mrs. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the draft regulation to amend the Homeschooling Regulation; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mrs. Rouleau, Minister Responsible for the Metropolis and the Montréal Region, Mr. Arcand, Leader of the Official Opposition, and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the special status of Montréal's Gay Village as a place of refuge and emancipation for Québec's LGBT+ communities;

THAT the National Assembly recall that the appropriation and investment in this safe space by LGBT+ communities contribute to making homosexuality and transsexuality more visible within Québec society;

THAT the National Assembly mark and celebrate the Village's special vocation as a place where all Québec LGBT+ communities can feel they belong.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), together with Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin), Mrs. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda—Témiscamingue), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on transferring the equivalent of one percent of the Québec Sales Tax to the municipalities; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Girault, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, together with Mrs. Robitaille (Bourassa-Sauvé), Mrs. Dorion (Taschereau), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm its support for Mrs. Nathalie Morin, a Quebecer who is pleading to leave Saudi Arabia with her children:

THAT it reaffirm its solidarity with Mrs. Morin's mother, Mrs. Johanne Durocher, and applaud her courage and determination;

THAT it reiterate its concern for Mrs. Morin's situation, since her relatives have not heard from her since October 2018;

THAT it reaffirm the importance Quebecers place on protecting and promoting human rights and freedoms, which form the basis for Québec's international action;

THAT the National Assembly mark the steps taken by the Government of Canada and urge it to immediately ramp up its efforts to ensure the safety and repatriation of Mrs. Nathalie Morin and her children. By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), together with Mrs. LeBel, Minister of Justice, Mrs. Charbonneau (Mille-Îles), Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mrs. Hivon (Joliette) and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved:

THAT the National Assembly welcome the fact that Québec is one of the most advanced nations when it comes to LGBT+ people's rights and a true leader in the field, having been the second state in the world to authorize same-sex civil union in 2002;

THAT it recognize that there is still progress to be made and that we all must be vigilant, especially with respect to the online violence experienced by LGBT+ people;

THAT the Assembly ask the Québec Government to commit to fighting the harassment and cyberbullying of LGBT+ people by supporting the awareness campaigns of organizations mobilized around this issue.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 15 May 2019, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mrs. Dorion (Taschereau).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to confirm that

- 1) the structuring public transit network project for Québec City will be carried out as planned, without dividing it into parts or carrying it out in phases;
- 2) the project will be funded with federal funds, according to the agreed plan, as soon as possible; and
- it will demand Québec's full and rightful share of funding for building green infrastructure throughout Québec.

At 6.13 o'clock p.m., Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7.30 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 7.30 o'clock p.m.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Culture and Education on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 12, An Act to clarify the scope of the right to free education and to allow the regulation of certain financial contributions that may be required, together with the amendments transmitted by Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) and Mrs. Labrie (Sherbrooke).

The amendment proposed by Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) to section 15 of the bill was declared in order. However, the amendment she proposed to section 1 was declared out of order since it has the effect of contradicting the original proposed section.

The amendment proposed by Mrs. Labrie (Sherbrooke) to section 1 was declared in order.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. LeBel (Rimouski).
