The President issued his directive on the point of privilege raised by Mr. Proulx, Official Opposition House Leader, on 3 June 2019 regarding the announcement by a Member of the parliamentary group forming the Government of a select committee on child prostitution, in the media and on social media, despite the fact that the committee had not yet been appointed by the Assembly.

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

In a ruling given at the beginning of the Legislature on a similar subject, in which communications emanating from the Government were at issue, the Chair recalled the importance of a number of principles in this area: the Government's right and duty to inform citizens, but also the requirement that such communications reflect respect for and deference to the Assembly and its Members. The public must not have the impression that a proposed measure is a *fait accompli* and that Parliament has no role to play in examining and adopting it. Thus, when parliamentary action is required for a measure to materialize, Ministers and Members alike must, in their communications, be mindful of not diminishing the role that belongs to all the Members of Parliament.

Out of respect for the Assembly, when a parliamentarian wishes to express himself or herself on an issue under discussion among the various political groups and the independent Members and a decision has not yet been made, it would be advisable for one's comments to remain nuanced to avoid implying that the decision is practically a done deal.

Therefore, as long as the Assembly has not carried a motion appointing the select committee, the latter cannot be considered as existing. The act of establishing a select committee is a strong symbolic gesture and reflects the importance given to an issue. Obviously, Members are not to be prevented from expressing their opinion on issues they discuss among themselves and the orders that might eventually be referred to Members sitting on such a committee. However, the Chair stresses that when Members wish to make an announcement about upcoming decisions, they should do so after the decision has been made, unless they clearly indicate that the announcement is "subject to" a decision by the Assembly.

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions
