The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin) tabled the following:

A copy of an article in the Vancouver Sun daily newspaper, dated 28 March 2019, entitled "Now is the time to invest in Montreal real estate".

At the request of the President, Mrs. Roy, Minister of Culture and Communications, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Arseneau (Îlesde-la-Madeleine), together with Mrs. Roy, Minister of Culture and Communications, Mr. Benjamin (Viau), Mrs. Dorion (Taschereau) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly affirm that the French language is a rich expression of the identity of Québec and Montréal and that it must be highlighted at international events;

THAT it note that the use of French only, as the language of hospitality, declined from 84% to 75% in Montréal from 2010 to 2017, according to the report on the evolution of the linguistic situation in Québec, released in April 2019;

THAT it recall that "Bonjour" is one of the French words best known by non-French speakers the world over;

THAT it recall that this word magnificently expresses Quebecers' warmth and hospitality;

THAT, therefore, it invite all merchants and employees interacting with local and international customers to warmly welcome them with the greeting "Bonjour".

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Mrs. Guilbault, Deputy Premier and Minister Responsible for the Capitale-Nationale Region, moved a motion about the Capitale-Nationale region; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin), together with Mrs. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda-Témiscamingue), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the importance to Québec's economy of the alcoholic beverage sector businesses holding small-scale production permits or distiller's permits;

THAT it recall that in 2018 the Liberal Government passed the *Act to modernize the legal regime applicable to liquor permits and to amend various other legislative provisions with regard to alcoholic beverages* to make Québec alcoholic products more accessible;

THAT it ask the CAQ Government to continue the work already under way and to further promote Québec alcoholic product sales by modernizing the SAQ's business model, and that this modernization exclude any privatization, even in part, of the SAQ.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

Mrs. D'Amours (Mirabel) made a statement, in accordance with section 25 of the *Code of ethics and conduct of the Members of the National Assembly*.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), together with Mrs. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, Mrs. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly reiterate the 5 priority intervention areas of the national policy to combat homelessness entitled "Politique nationale de lutte à l'itinérance" adopted on 14 February 2014, namely: housing; health services and social services; income; education and social and socio-professional integration; social cohabitation and issues related to judicialization;

THAT, in this regard, it ask that the agreement to be concluded between Québec and Canada on the new "Reaching Home" program help consolidate Québec's policy directions as regards the fight against homelessness and that the federal funds help support a diverse range of actions in that fight.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Private Members' Public Bills
